

CLUB CAPIAINS REPORT 1984 - 85

Season 1984/85 was my 6th as Club Captain and it was the easiest so far due to the conscientiousness of the Patrol Captains and the help of many members.

Patrols this season have been well attended with few people continuously defaulting. I thank the Patrol Captains for a job excellently done. In period A we ran 4 Patrols which was expanded to 5 for period B. Running 5 patrols stretched our man power too thinly at times with some patrols missing people holdingimportant qualifications. Each number was expected to complete approximately 50 hours on patrol and many completed far more than this as voluntaries. Our present active membership of 48 is still growing and so individual patrol hours will steadily fall.

We achieved our best results even in the patrol inspections this year.

Inspection 1: 472 - 4 Questions Wrong
Inspection 2: 476 - 2 Questions Wrong
Inspection 3: 480 - Full Points.

A loss of Only 12 points for the season is the best we have done. This again has only gained us second place in the State, only 10 points behind Waratah Beach. State Centre has introduced an award for "Continued Excellence" in the patrol competition to be presented every 3 years.

During the Season these major events were held:-

- The Club Championships: was an excellent day of fun and competition in perfect weather. I wish to thank John Cantwell for recording the results and starting, I also wish to thank Venus Bay for the use of their boat.
- The Junior Carnival: again was an excellent day with fine weather. I thank all those of the Caravan Park who ran the stall. Nine serious IRB rescues were performed by the highly skilled IRB driver and crew in the large surf of that day.

Cape Paterson's prescence was strongly felt at Portland at the State Titles this year. Apart from individual competitors a team made a spectacular attempt at the march past. A very similar team made a "unique spectacle" strolling around Pt. Leo beach in the National march past competition. These evenets were great for the CLub and they allowed the state to see Cape Paterson in action again.
