Our Active membership has fallen from 42 to 40 in the past year. To try to obtain more members a recruitment committee has been established, our club needs more members to ease the workload on everyone. We also need more members pulling their own weight. This season only 10 out of the 40 active members did not default a patrol. This is clearly not good enough so before next season I ask that everybody considers the commitment needed to be an active lifesaver before rejoining. Those that continue to default will be asked to appear before the committee.

With both the Radio Operators Certificate and the Inflatable Rescue Boat Crewmans Certificate being combined into the Bronze Medallion Syllabus more effort will be required by both instructors and new Bronze candidates alike. Members already possessing their Bronze should familiarize themselves with the new Bronze requirements before the coming season.

Cape Paterson as a club finished 19 out of 27 clubs in the patrol competition. This is down from 11th last year, this drop is mainly due to a certain Senior members resuscitation timings and another's board rescues. Cape Paterson came last in the Bass district, I believe at Cape we have the members to be first in the district.
