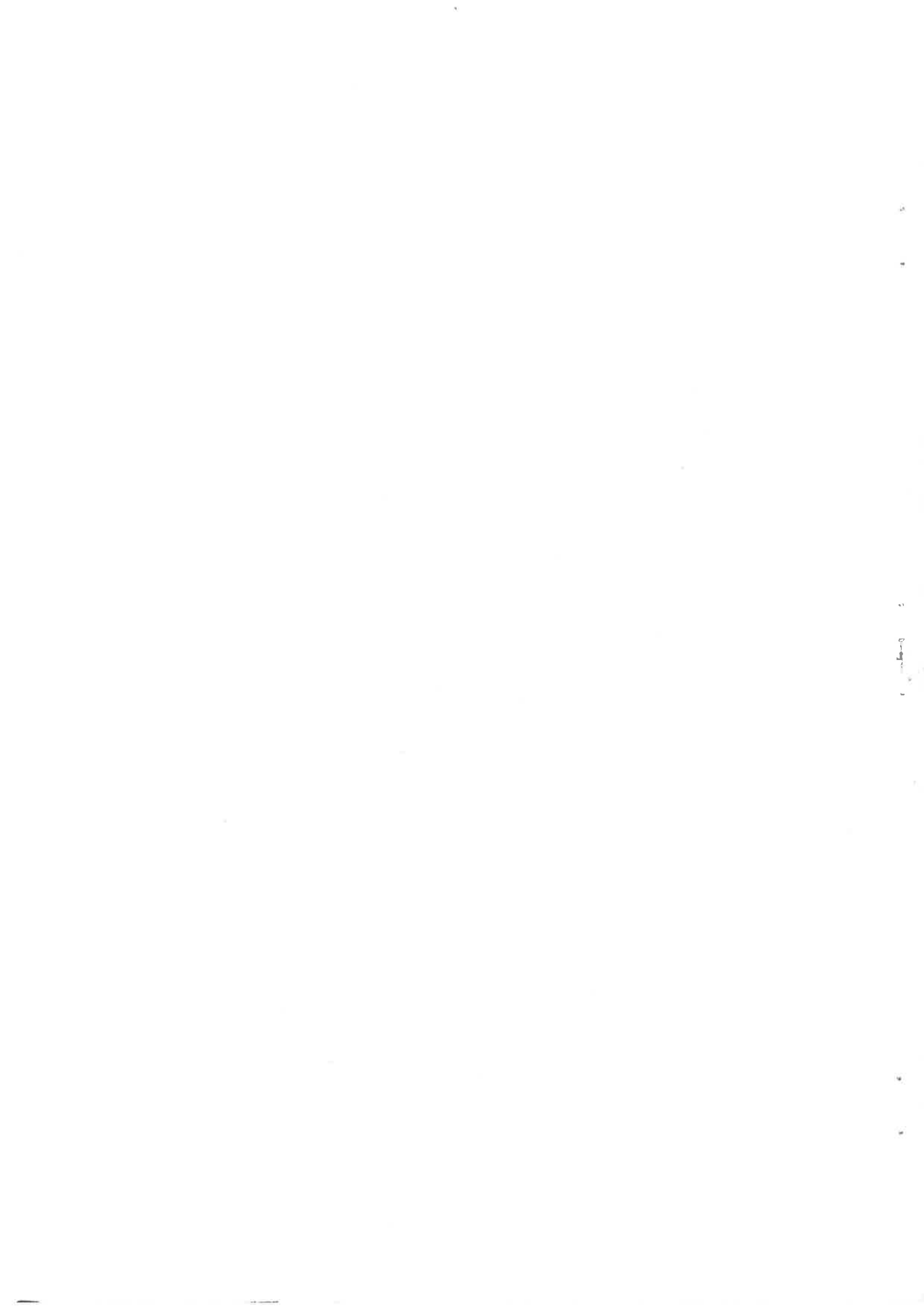

NIPPERS REPORT

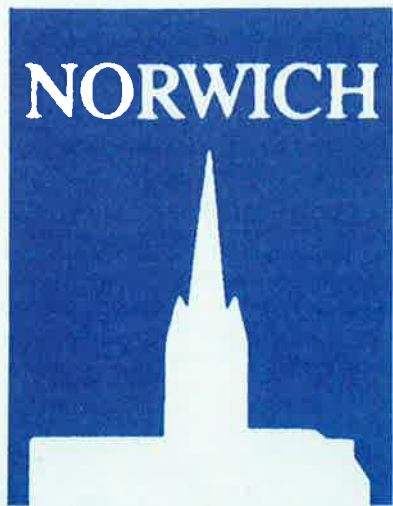

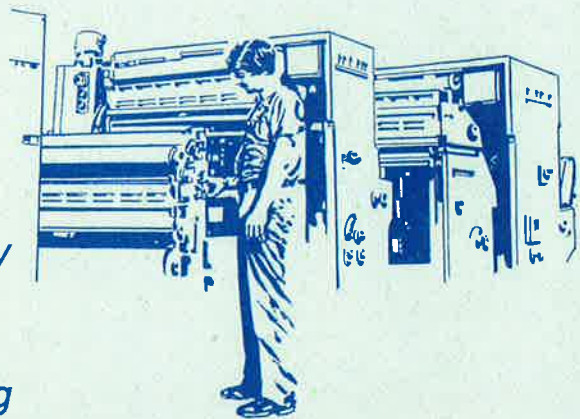
