

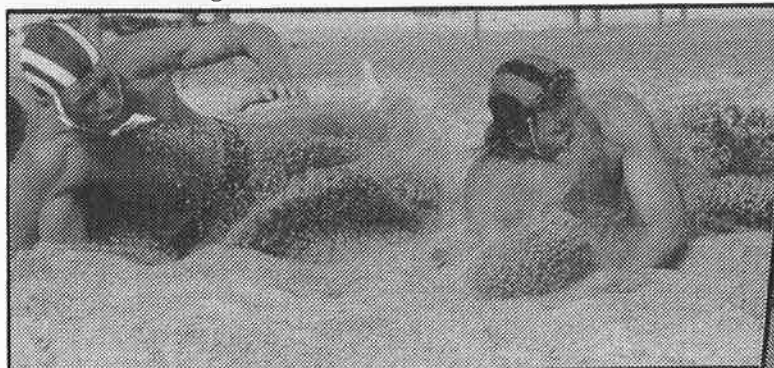

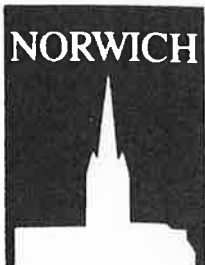

CLUB CAPTAIN'S REPORT

I am pleased to say that this has once again been a successful season, with high club moral and a great deal of enthusiasm being shown by new and established members. It is only this self generated drive that the club can continue to exist, and more importantly to develop further and attain better levels of achievement. We have begun to see this with more new members joining the club, a much greater involvement in competition and there has also been a greater role in activities outside of the Club, for example the Inverloch Channel Challenge.

I have been reasonably impressed with our patrolling of the beach this season. We are not a beach that has a great many rescues but whenever an incident arises we are able to respond quickly and efficiently. The teamwork that occurs within patrols and the club, is excellent. One area that I would like to see develop in the future is Junior members taking an active role in Patrol organisation and coordination. This allows you to learn more from experience and at the same time to develop leadership skills. Having more experienced members is a benefit to all. The use of the IRB trailer and having the Boat Shed lockable has proved to be fantastic (no more carrying of gear before and after every patrol) and I would like to thank all involved.

Our performance in the State Patrol Efficiency Competition was improved this year. There were no inexcusable losses of points (excluding the LOGBOOK!) and Examiners were pleased with our achievement. Lets hope that next season we can eliminate even the smallest of errors and win not only the District but get into the Top Five in the State. This is possible if we do all of the time, what we currently do most of the time.

Without doubt the most important goal of our club is to increase the safety of the people who use the beach. The only way we can achieve this is to recruit and train new members and to have the best of equipment for them to use.

This season we have purchased two new hand Held radios which has enabled Patrol-to-Boat communication. Next season we may be sharing our frequency with Wonthaggi L.S.C. and this will increase our combined rescue ability and also provide back up to each other when needed. The Norwich Duck has had its first full season and next year we will have a new motor.

I would very much like to thank Sharyn and her Instructors, for the running of a very successful Bronze Camp. Although sleeping in the bunk house was cramped, it was a fun and eye-opening week for all.

The development of the Nipper Program excelled to even greater heights this season with record numbers attending the sessions being organised and run by Donna. The approval of parents and members indicated that the Club is on track with the expectations of what the Junior Program is to provide.

Thankyou to all active and other members, who have contributed over the last season and I look forward to being able to work with you all in a bigger and better season next year.

Recipient: The person who has shown excellence in service to the Cape Paterson SLSC (The Club).

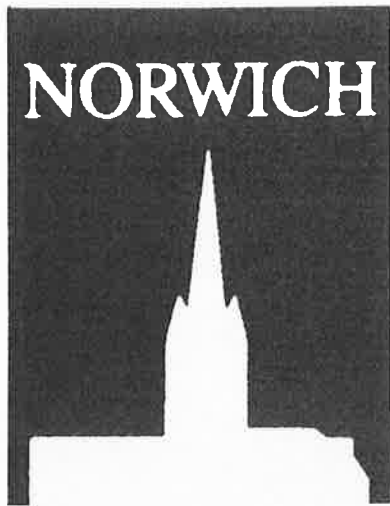
Criteria:

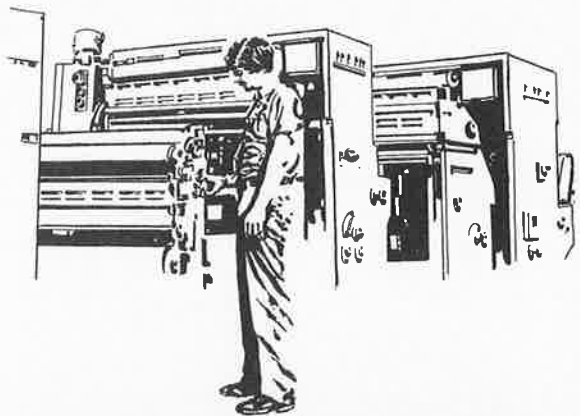
