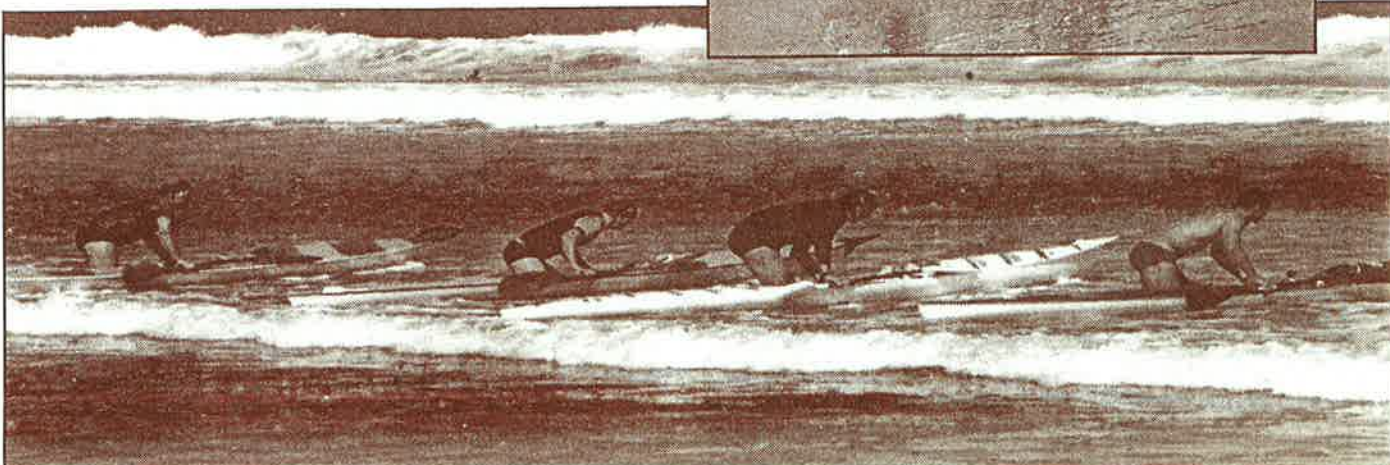

## CLUB CAPTAINS REPORT

It is most pleasing to be able to look back at the successes of the season. It indicates how strong the Club is currently. The commitment of members is very good, with all aspects of the Club being developed. The activities of the Club are numerous, apart from the patrolling of the beach. We have hosted two carnivals; the Junior (Nipper) Carnival in January, at which over 100 competitors competed. At the Duck Carnival in May, although being exceptionally cold, it was a very successful and fun weekend event. Active members were involved in the preparation, supervision and officiating at all of these events.

The coordination of the patrolling active members has been made easier this season with the commitment of Simon Marangio (Vice Club Captain), Sam Chippindall (Junior Club Captain) and the four Patrol Captains: Robert Harvey, Sharyn Fitzgerald, Alison Parsons and Alistair Low. Although we did not do as well as hoped in the State Patrol Competition, the standard of the patrols was very good. This is in part due to the more experienced members developing their own skills and understanding by assisting with the instruction of new members. This is something that we need to continue to develop. It enables the better instruction of bronzie's and SLSC's and at the same time it develops knowledge and enhanced communication skills. This season the use of the Belt and Reel was ceased. Although this is a recognised icon of Surf Life Saving, and will continue to be used in some competition, it is a piece of equipment that has become redundant as a life saving aid.

The provision of active Club functions has been extremely well coordinated by Simon Marangio. I thank him for his support and for the initiatives that he has implemented. Part of Simon's brief has been to follow up patrol defaults. This is not a witch hunt but is essential if the Club is to advance its provision of care. Our primary function is to patrol the beach. This is not an enjoyable task and I thank Simon for doing it so diligently.

The 1993/1994 Club Championships were won by Patrol 4. A fantastic day over the easter weekend was a change from championships held on this weekend in the past. The organisation of the carnival was performed by Sam Chippindall the Junior Club Captain. His good organisation and the very effective refereeing of Peter Pearce provided for enjoyable competition (regardless of level).

The activities of the Patrols has included the assistance of the Nipper Program. This is the future life-blood of the Club and it is terrific to see active members helping and enjoying the supervision of events. The proof of commitment was evident on the day of the Nipper Carnival where we had a huge number of water safety officers helping in very cold conditions. Another activity is the regular cleaning of the beach. A task which none of us enjoy but benefits the Club with positive public relations and a grant from the Wonthaggi council.

The human resources of the Club is our most valuable asset. The training that is required for members to become active has ballooned in numbers since the introduction of the Bronze Camp. This requires much organisation and we are lucky to have Sharyn Fitzgerald as our Chief Instructor and a large number of instructors. The experience of instructing lets you reassess what you thought that you previously understood and is great fun.

We are a voluntary organisation but with a legal duty of care we expect a lot from each members' commitment. There are many who work above and beyond this level. Each year the Club awards a "Best Junior and Best Senior Active Club Member Award" to recognise this.

David Myers is the 1993/1994 Best Junior Active Club Member. In his second year at the Club he has been very involved in all activities. His relaxed attitude and willingness to get involved and help with anything from building bunks, to making trips to the tip, is much appreciated.

The Best Senior Active Club Member Award is awarded to Robert Harvey. As a Patrol Captain, Instructor and one of the more senior members of the Club. He has promoted the aims and goals of the Club and has worked to achieve them. He has a very dry sense of humour and entertains his patrol with his ability to quote huge chunks of Monty Python.

Competition is an integral part of Surf Life Saving. Apart from the obvious physical benefits, carnivals are fantastic fun and let you get to know how other Clubs function. Dean Manns, as Team Manager and Alan Taylor as Coach have been enthusiastic in their duties. Several weekend trips have been organised and were very successful. We need to develop our involvement in competition and Alan or Dean would like more Junior members to become involved.

As the Club Captain I believe that our most valuable asset is the members of the Club. We have a terrific group of people and this means that our prospective viability is very good. We should congratulate ourselves on our achievements over the last season and prepare for the future.

## CHIEF INSTRUCTORS REPORT

The continued success of our main recruiting drive, the 'live-in' Bronze Camp was made possible by the combined effort of a number of people in the club, including the instructors. Numbers of bronze candidates were lower this year, only eight in total, although this was more than made up for by the overabundance of SLSC's, with 17 new members to the club. My appreciation goes to those members who willingly gave up their free time to help in the day-to-day running of the camp, along with extra instruction and guidance throughout the week. Thank-you to Jim, Dean and Beefy for their assistance with IRB-driving and instruction.

Following on from the award of Bronze, once again an ARC squad of five candidates were skilfully trained and examined in December. With thanks to Michael Henry who seemed intent on instructing a squad for every award on the syllabus. For the first time, this season a number of squads were instructed for their first aid certificate. Thanks to Karen Phillips for making time in her busy schedule (between penguins) to instruct the first squad. Thirteen candidates received their first aid certificate, that still leaves a lot of members who have the pre-requisites to train for this award.
