Regualifications were held on Sunday, 18th December, 1994 with all members passing on the day. This enabled the Club to form four patrols.

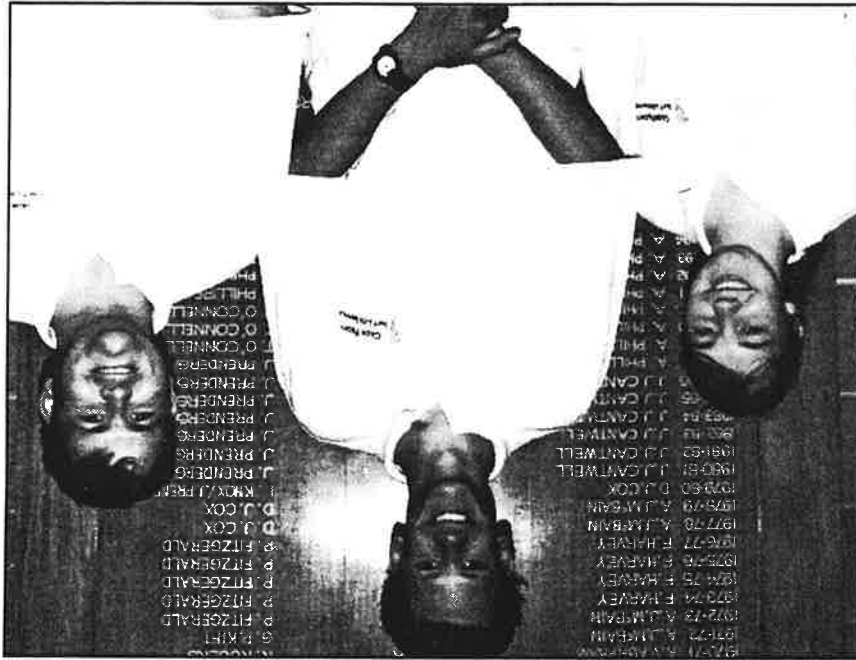

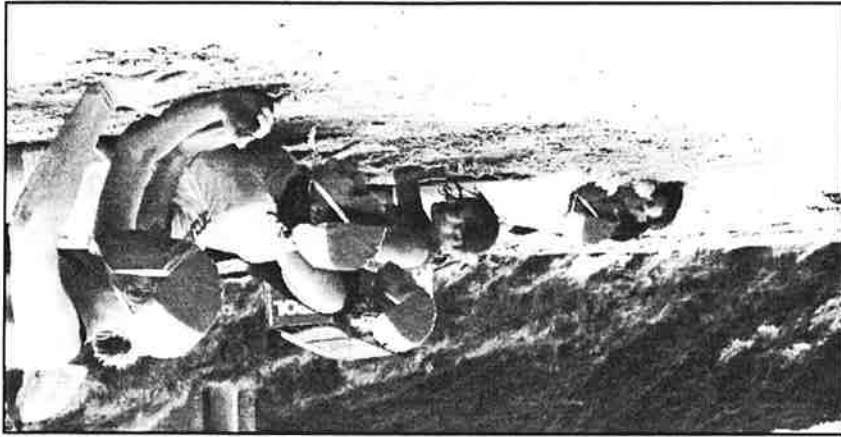
FUNDRAISING

club captain's report

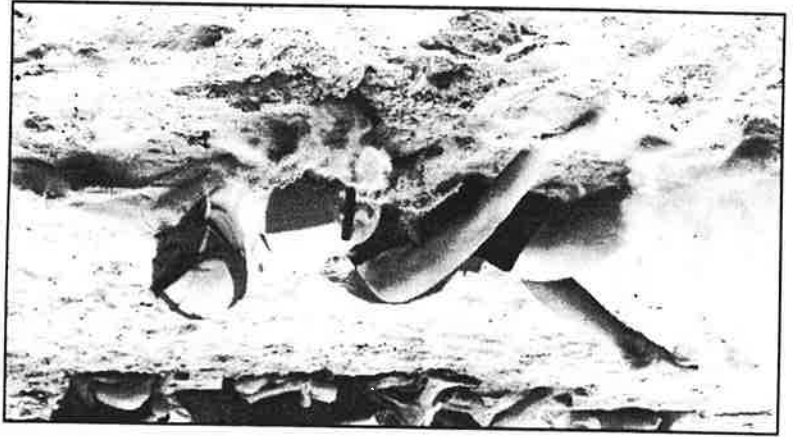
The Cape Paterson Surf Life Saving Club has had a fantastic season with many activities associated with the active members.

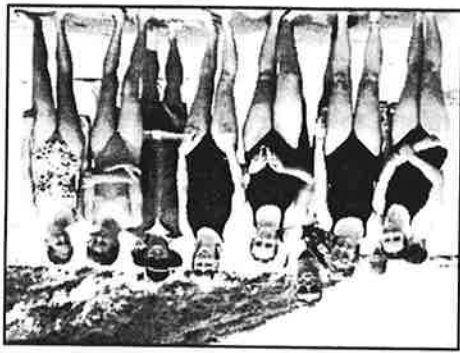

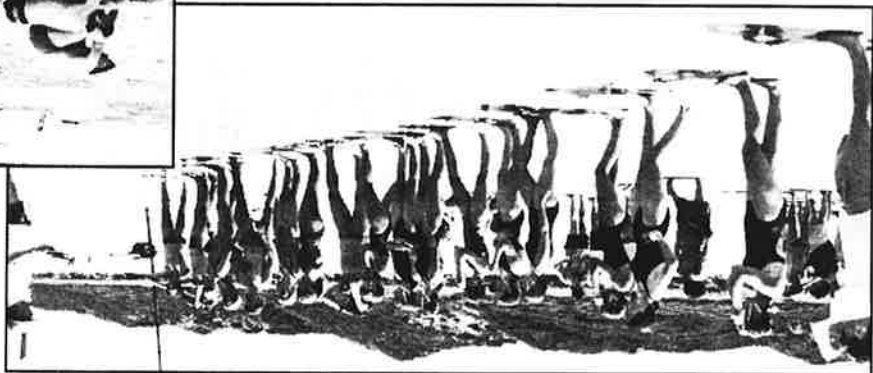


Team manager's report

Having a carnival at Cape Paterson was the perfect opportunity to experience the carnival atmosphere. It was great to see plenty of members having a go!

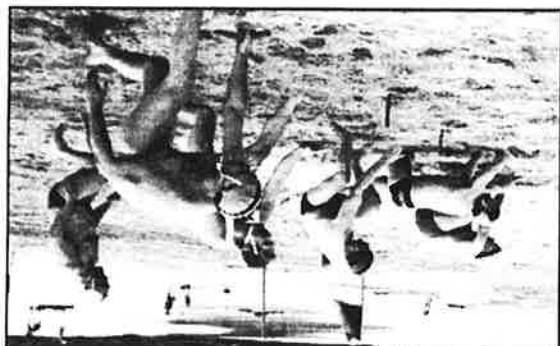
The Gippsland Titles at Waratah Beach was well attended by our club with Jessica, Eliza, Simone and Sam coming first in their events.

There are many opportunities for junior members of Cape Paterson SLSC to become more involved, whether this be by

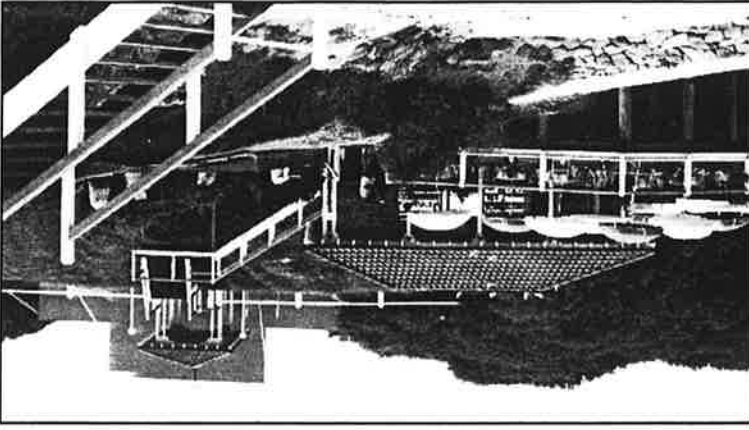

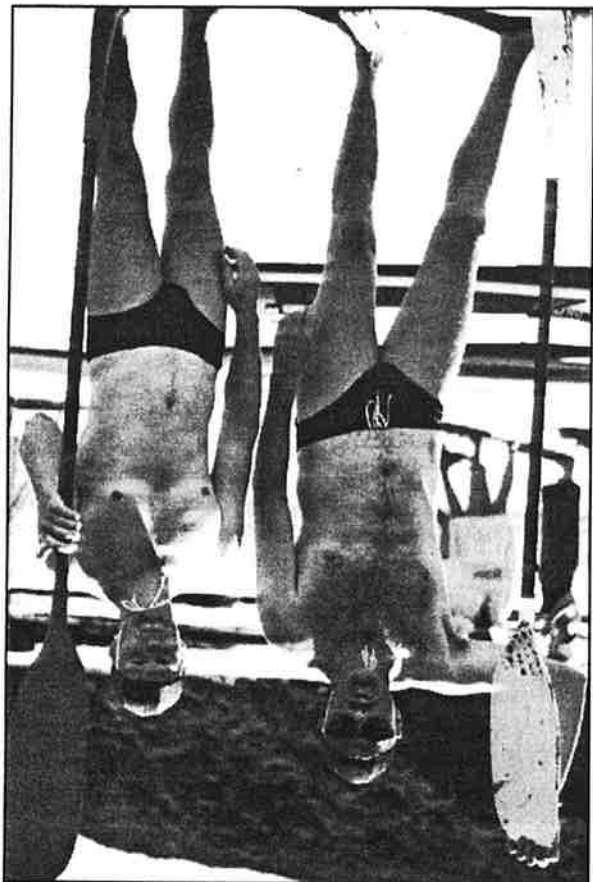
