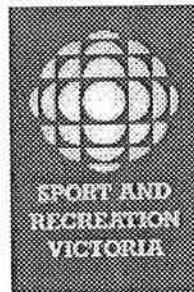

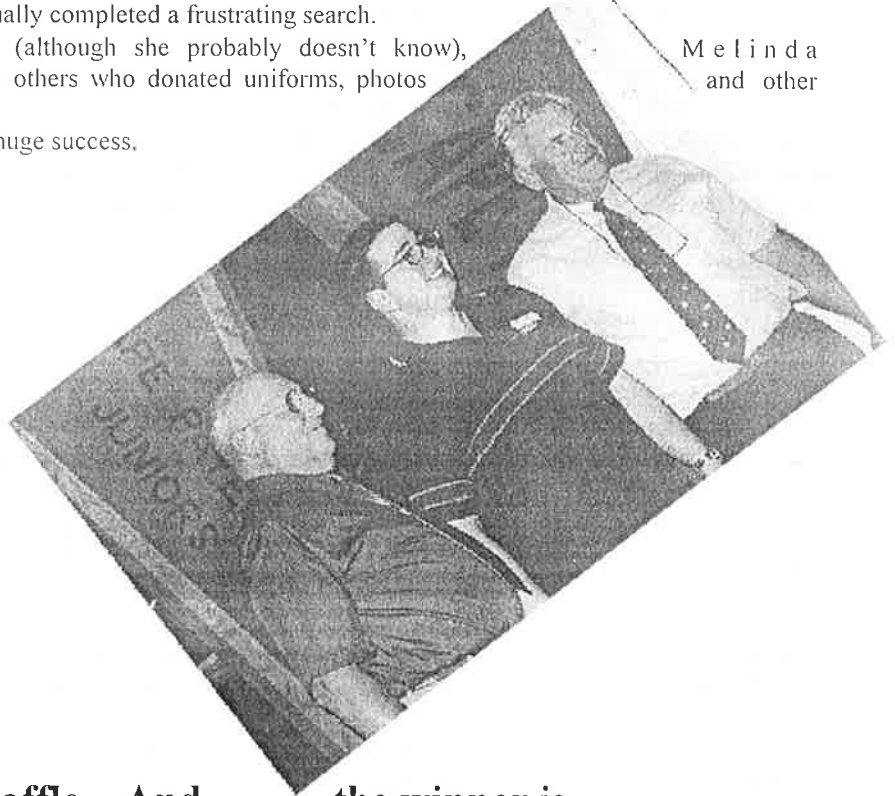
THANKYOUS – 40th Celebration

President's Report

Congratulations to all for a successful 1999/2000 season. We should congratulate ourselves that we have completed another season of safe patrolling of the surf beach with no major accidents on our beach and we have responded to many incidents of significant nature. Being active in prevention of incidents is a vital task. Through experience and training our Active members have been promoting a safe beach environment. To achieve these tasks there have been a large number of members and helpers in all aspects of the club. I would extend a thank-you to all position holders and general committee members. It is their commitment that enables the club to operate and remain organized.

The building work has been inspected by the Department of Sport and Recreation and they have certified that it has been completed to the specifications of their 21st Century Community Grant. Whilst many people have completed hours of work, there are several individuals who have maintained the effort for the last 18 months. Special thanks to Arthur Phillips, Tony O'Connell, John Manns and Barbara Manns. At times these individuals have been working full time, on what is now a fantastic looking building and facilities. In addition to this we have been very lucky to have the support of several local tradesman who have given of their time and advice. Thanks to Wayne Hynes and Rod McLean for countless hours and valuable contacts with local authorities.

Fundraising is a vital aspect of our club. We have continued various activities and are looking to extending our variety of events. An emphasis on yearly events means that large amounts are raised with significant effort on behalf of members and it also serves to raise our public profile. The weekly Tavern raffle has raised over \$4000 dollars and has continued to raise the clubs profile with local business contacts. Paddy's market was again successful and we hope that someone will take the reins for next season.

With the impending introduction of the GST the club has been preparing with Barbara Manns completing various GST Conferences and seminars. We have purchased a fax machine to assist with GST and active patrol setup requirements, and have been developing the appropriate GST compliant software and expertise. There should be minimal affect on our overall operations and finances, but there is sure to be greater time required to administer the process.

The club celebrated its 40th Birthday with a very successful Weekend in March. The range of memorabilia and stories from members, including, many who were involved with the foundation of the club, was fun, interesting and educational. Many of the operational issues faced by the club have not changed significantly in this time but it was widely acknowledged that the improvements in rescue equipment and medical treatment have dramatically increased our rescue effectiveness.

Our active membership has continued to develop and has been supported by the work of Rebecca Bohsack as the Junior Club Delegate (Nipper Coordinator). We now have over twenty nipper boards for use next season. If parents are interested in assisting it is possible to complete an Active award such as the Surf Life Saving Certificate or Bronze Medallion. If you are interested please contact the Club Captain or Chief Instructor. This will give you a greater insight to the club, develop valuable first aid knowledge and assist the running of events.

This year the competition team has developed in strength and depth. Performances at all levels of competition have given younger and 'more mature' members the opportunity for skill and fitness development. Thank-you to David Mills in his role of Team Manager. To support our active members the club covers the entry cost for individuals to compete at carnivals.

Thankyou again to all who have assisted the club during the last twelve months and I look forward to seeing you on the beach next season.

Treasurer's Report.

MEMBERSHIP FOR 1999/2000 SEASON: We have 223 paid-up members in the following categories: Life Members 13. Active Seniors 24. Active Juniors, Active Cadets 21. Nippers 71. Associates 67. Long Service 2. Reserve Active 2.

FUNDRAISING: Once again our main 'Fund Raiser' was the Meat Tray Raffles each Friday night at the Cape Tavern. This year Arthur raised a massive \$4,442.80 – our sincere thanks to Arthur & Nancye for their assistance in swelling our funds.

'LIFE SAVING INTO THE 21ST CENTURY' GRANT – It has been a very busy year for a lot of our members who were working on the refurbishment to the clubhouse. Up to the end of April we have spent \$59,322.67 and received \$36,998.99 of the \$50,500 grant. The final claim has now been sent to the Department of Sport & Recreation and the final inspection will take place in mid June after which we will be paid the balance of \$13,501.01 providing the department inspectors are sure that our work has been completed to their satisfaction.

I don't think the club can ever give enough thanks to Arthur Phillips, Tony O'Connell and John Manns who between them have spent 1,141 hours out of a total of 1,881 hours claimed working on the clubhouse renovations (and are still finishing the work in June). I am sure that they and many others have spent hours in excess of the totals they have recorded in their books. Many thanks to all the other members and helpers who donated their time to make up the other 740 hours. Also thank you to Wendy Prendergast and the girls from Beacon Hills College for the hours they spent painting the toilet areas. Well done all!

GRANTS: Two further applications for grants have been sent to enable the club to complete the renovations by remodeling the kitchen, making provision for an office downstairs and improving the 'wash down' area outside. If we are successful with the Community Facilities Grant application, it will only cost the club members some time and plenty of effort. If we are unsuccessful with that grant but obtain a further grant from the "Life Saving into the 21st Century Grant Scheme", we will have to find approximately \$5,000 to enable the work to be completed. Hopefully, by the time the Annual Meeting is held we will know whether we have been successful or not. During the year we were successful in obtaining a grant of \$2,250 from the Country Action Grant scheme to purchase 28 Nipper boards – enough to see the Nippers set up for quite some time to come. Also \$300 from a Sunsmart Grant to help provide Rash Vests for sun protection for the Nippers. These are being made by Joan Scott at a very good price and they will be ready for next season. Thank you Joan!

Club Captain/Boat Captain's Report

During the season, the Cape Paterson SLSC celebrated its past achievements, successes and history over the past 40 years. Season 1999/2000 was no exception, producing many notable achievements.

The Club was able to improve its patrol efficiency and successfully performed 7 rescues and 4 major first aid cases. The level of competency, professionalism and teamwork displayed by active during the execution of rescues and serious first aid situations deserves recognition and has been the best testimony to the work carried out by active members every season. In particular, the efforts of junior club members, Robert McGregor, Tim McGregor and David Ingle who responded to a first response emergency call with no emergency equipment or vehicles available to them deserves special recognition. The professionalism and innovative manner in which they were able to respond to the emergency was exceptional.

Highlights of season 1999/2000 include:

- Improved Patrol Efficiency and Competency
- Successful completion of Bronze Medallions, Surf Rescue Certificates, Radio Operator's Certificates and Inflatable Rescue Boat Driver awards
- Near completion of club house renovations and new bathroom facilities
- Successful Nipper Season including winning the inaugural district Nipper Challenge and the Nipper Carnival
- Strong Performances in competition and carnivals including Victorian Titles & Gippsland Titles. Our beach relay teams, produced many wins and final births
- Improved performance in IRB carnivals
- Development of the Surf boat and female boat crew

The Cape Paterson Surf Life Saving Club must meet many diverse and sometimes conflicting obligations including, patrol and emergency response duties, beach management, other community service obligations and training, domestic duties, fundraising, training and development of new and existing members, competition training and involvement, gear maintenance as well as social functions. Demands are increasingly made on limited club resources and members to meet all these obligations. The club will only be able to meet all, or one of these goals through the cooperation and understanding of all members both active and non-active junior and senior. I am resigning my position as Club Captain of the Cape Paterson Surf Life Saving Club in season 2000/2001 and believe that the enthusiasm and ideas being generated by members is pivotal to the Club's future prosperity. I wish everyone the best for season 2000/2001.

Surf Boat Report.

It has been sometime since the Club has had its Surfboat, albeit an antiquated one, in operation. Season 1999/2000 has seen the emergence of a motivated and dedicated female boat crew who began learning how to row in late August 1999. The crew, consisting of Debra Middleton, Nyree Potter, Simone Rogers, Rod Rogers and myself had no idea how to row when they started, and have got the Surfboat up and running purely through their own effort and determination. The transformation in skill has been amazing. Particularly given the lack of resources, support and adequate equipment (ie. no pump and 25 year old oars).

The re-emergence of the Surf Boat has raised the interest and invaluable support of past members Kevin Donohue, and Brian Donohue (alias Bongo) and John Sill and the female boat crew at Woolamai Surf Life Saving Club. Their support has been instrumental in the Development of the Surf Boat Crew and enabled the crew's competing at the Gippsland Titles. Thanks to the generosity of the Woolamai SLSC the crew were also able to be involved in their sponsors day at Cat Bay in May and gained valuable experience in negotiating the surf and catching waves from the more experienced crews.

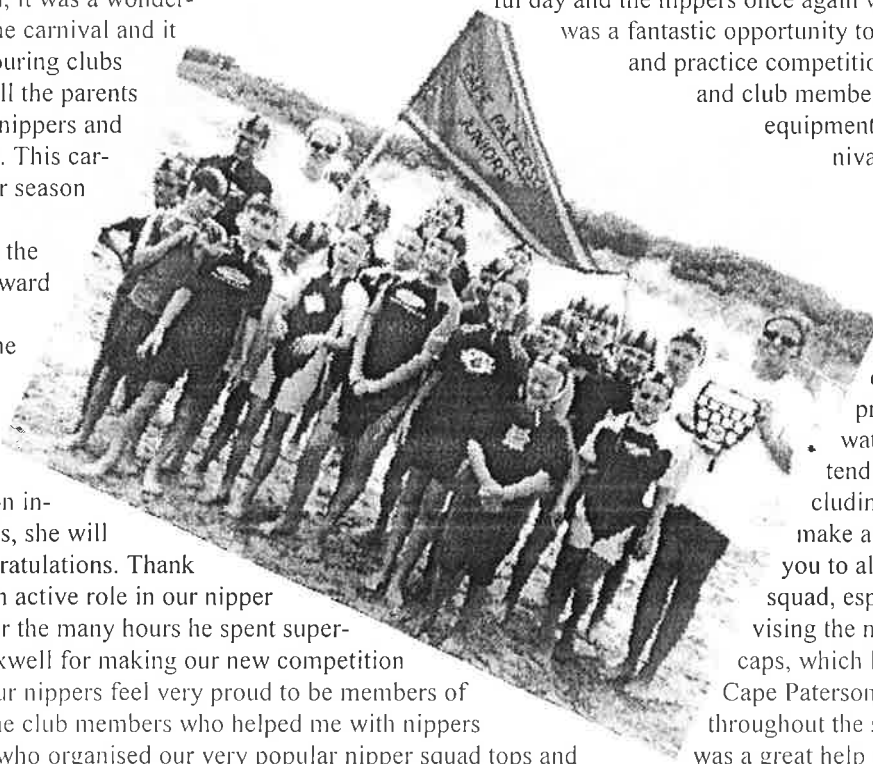

On the other hand, we now have new board/ski racks in the club as a result of the building works, which are a vast improvement on the old board racks.

It has also been a long season for the IRBs. After some problems early in the season that saw us without an active IRB for two weeks, the motors have run very well. The purchase of two heavy-duty motor trolleys has been fantastic, and has taken the back pain out of moving and caring for these valuable pieces of rescue equipment.
