TREASURER'S ANNUAL REPORT

The past year has been an exceptionally busy one for me – returning to T.A.F.E. part time to learn how to switch the club accounts over to the M.Y.O.B. accounting system. After a few hiccups, mainly caused by the G.S.T., it seems to be working o.k. (It would be much easier without the G.S.T.)

Final payment of \$13,501.01 was received for the first Grant from the Lifesaving into the 21st Century grant. Arthur, John and Tony, with the help of a very few others, have already started the second stage upgrading the kitchen, office and wash-down areas. We can only claim accounts for this second grant when ALL work is completed which must be prior to 31st August 2001.

Income for the year was down a bit on last year mainly because of the grant money received in the previous year, and also due to the cancellation of Paddy's Market, etc. "Membership Day" ran at a loss in part due to quite a few invited guests for the official opening on the renovated clubhouse.

The Electricity account was well down on last year because the meter reader could not access the meter box. (We have had an account from TXU for \$713.40 in May for the arrears.) The Australian Tax Office has refunded \$1,011.14 the difference between what we paid and received due to the G.S.T.

You will note that the Personal Accident Insurance in the last two reports. An account for this insurance has been received in May from State Centre.

The private use of the clubhouse telephone is a problem. Some members have accounts outstanding (at the time of preparing this report) for quite large amounts. To collate the phone accounts to be paid by members takes between 10 and 15 hours at least twice a year!

All our Bronzies from camps one and two passed with flying colours.

Throughout the season we also had members training for their Silver Medallion (IRB Driver) and IRB Crew Certificates and March saw their exam ... finally! It was postponed a number of times due to no examiners being available, but at least we knew they were ready.

Over all we saw just over 100 awards awarded to active members, nipper parents, new members and nippers this season. This saw our club gain the fifth highest amount of awards put through by any club in the state. We finished behind Portsea, Anglesea, Torquay and Ocean Grove, which is no shame to us!

This could not have been done without the dedication of members to gain awards and help from the following people who helped in a range of areas from Basic Resuscitation Certificates to behind the scenes. We took a step back and looked at the big picture and we asked ourselves if we were parents with children in the program, what would we want the program to achieve and how would we want it to be conducted. We also asked ourselves, as Nipper delegates what is our responsibility to all the people – Nippers, volunteers and parents – that are involved in the program and what kind of culture did we want to help build in the club.

We can up with a number of goals:

- To create a program which centred on the development of surf survival and lifesaving skills
- To develop our relationships with parents and children alike
- To increase participation by parents and other members who have not been involved in the past
- To co-ordinate a program that had a strong social focus as well as skill focus
- To make sure everyone who was part of the program felt equally important and enjoyed themselves
- To integrate the Nipper program into other parts of surf club life and break down communication barriers that previously existed
- To develop relationships with other clubs in the Bass Coast area through friendly competition and co-operation
- To make you feel that you are as important to the Club as any other patrolling or non-patrolling member
