Presidents Report.

The 42nd season spent patrolling Cape Paterson First Surf saw the club again successfully implement its prime objective to maintain a safe and protected environment for the swimming public. The four core members of each patrol are commended for their service to the Cape Paterson Community.

Awards: We all wondered how Nyree would improve upon last season but she has. More awards put through and importantly a greater level of recruiting. Running a bronze camp is a very onerous task requiring a huge commitment, I thank Robert Harvey for supporting Nyree through this major event in club life.

Nippers: The strength of our club is in its members and especially the up and coming younger members. Ang and Deb have maintained the very high standard set last season. The programs they have put in place with the nippers are both highly educational and entertaining. This is most evident when the older ones start training for their Surf Rescue Certificate and are very proficient right from the beginning.

FROM THE TREASURER

Our membership for this year is 230 – this includes Active Junior members from both Wonthaggi and Kew Secondary Colleges who have trained at our club.

Once again, the most outstanding fundraising effort was the Cape Tavern Raffles – thank you to Arthur and Nancye for the tremendous amount of \$4,757.45 raised during the last financial year.

Earlier this year we received the final payment for the “Life Saving into the 21st Century” Grant. Our sincere thanks go to the few members, and non-members, who assisted in Stage 2 of the refurbishment of the clubhouse.

One thing I would like to stress is that when given a cheque from the club, **PLEASE BANK IMMEDIATELY**. During this financial year a cheque issued in the previous financial year had to be cancelled resulting in the figures for both financial years being, virtually, incorrect and also taking quite considerable time to find the amount in question. With the M.Y.O.B. accounting system when a cheque has to be cancelled after being issued, it is automatically cancelled on the date the cheque was issued.

We would also like to thank Peter and Wendy Graham for the Crayfish Raffle over Easter. The raffle raised \$753.30. Our thanks also go to the Donohue family for donating the crayfish. Well done!

As is the case with all clubs, our Insurance premiums and Capitation fees have increased dramatically. It has cost the club \$7,714.52 for the year – next year it will probably be more as only the Nipper Capitation fees have risen this year. It is expected that all other categories will rise next year.

Please don't think that Bass Coast Shire have doubled our Beach Cleaning Grant. Last financial year we received \$2,700 for the year 2000. This financial year we have received \$2,700 in May '01 for 2001 and \$2,700 in April '02 for 2002.

Included in the Administration costs is \$398.17 for the Bombi Bulletin postage. Our thanks to Dean for printing the Bombi free of charge and also thanks to Kirsty who, I am sure, does a lot toward the compilation of the newsletter. I have also heard a whisper that David Mills is able to obtain the paper at a VERY nominal cost. Thanks, David.

NOTES TO AND FORMING PART OF THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

1. STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

This financial report is a special purpose financial report prepared in order to satisfy the provisions of the Rules of the Association and the requirements of the Associations Incorporation Act (Vic).

The financial report has been prepared in accordance with the requirements of the following applicable Australian Accounting Standards:

AAS 1: Profit and Loss or Other Operating Statements

AAS 8: Events Occurring after Reporting Date

No other Australian Accounting Standards, Urgent Issues Group Consensus Views or other authoritative pronouncements of the Australian Accounting Standards Board have been applied.

The financial report is prepared on a cash basis and is based on historical costs and does not take into account changing money values.

Club Captains Report

This season saw the innovation of a new patrolling system brought into the club after several seasons of a traditional 4-patrol format. Whilst the introduction of a fifth patrol did relieve the extra hours that patrolling members have done in the past, it did at times stretch the clubs resources in terms of patrolling numbers. It is vitally important that all patrolling members meet patrol commitments throughout the summer and contact myself if they are unable to do so.

There are many thankyou's to give out to patrolling members whom went above and beyond throughout the season. Firstly to my patrol captains: Nick Stone, Michael Mules, Peter Clarkson & Robert Harvey. Whether it be organising patrol rosters, doing extra hours, subbing for others or just keeping me informed of w'end events you guys all continue to make life a lot easier for me as a Club Captain. As patrol captains all of you continue to set an excellent examples for others to follow.

Nyree Potter continues to shine in her role of Chief Instructor for the second season running. Bronze camps in January but also for a school group in March, Nyree has shown excellent qualities in one of the toughest roles within the club. Angela Hawkes and Debra Mills (nee Middleton) also continued their roles as nipper delegates for a second summer running. Although the weather wasn't as kind as last year the girls continued to improve the safety and skills of our future lifesavers. The other pleasing aspect was the amount of people not only parents but also other active members willing to help with nippers, hopefully this trend will continue next summer.

Competition somewhat stalled over the summer with a greater emphasis placed on patrol mainly due to our new patrolling system. Both team managers in David Hawkes & Trent Doherty are looking to rectify this for season 2002/03. Some of the highlights for the season were the 4th place in U/19 beach relay finals at Vic's and also the effort of Lachlan Ford in making the U/16 beach sprint final, not bad for his first ever carnival.

This summer saw many seniors perform solidly throughout the summer, however there were no real standouts. With this in mind, this year we have no senior active member being awarded the Club Captain's trophy but instead two junior members sharing the junior award. Both Kendall Brown & Joe Coxon not only performed brilliantly whilst on patrol but also consistently helped out when needed with any extra activities around the club. Well done boys and congratulations. Special mention must also go to Scott Rosendale for his countless hours patrolling the Cape beaches.

This season saw the club finish 23rd overall in the patrol efficiency competition. Whilst this result may look disappointing on paper, the actual standard set from our patrolling members was extremely good. Our last inspection was unluckily on the wedding day of yours truly, leaving this day as an extremely difficult one for patrolling members.

Already looking forward to the start of the forthcoming season with a renewed enthusiasm with plans to strengthen the clubs position not only in patrol but also in competition*
