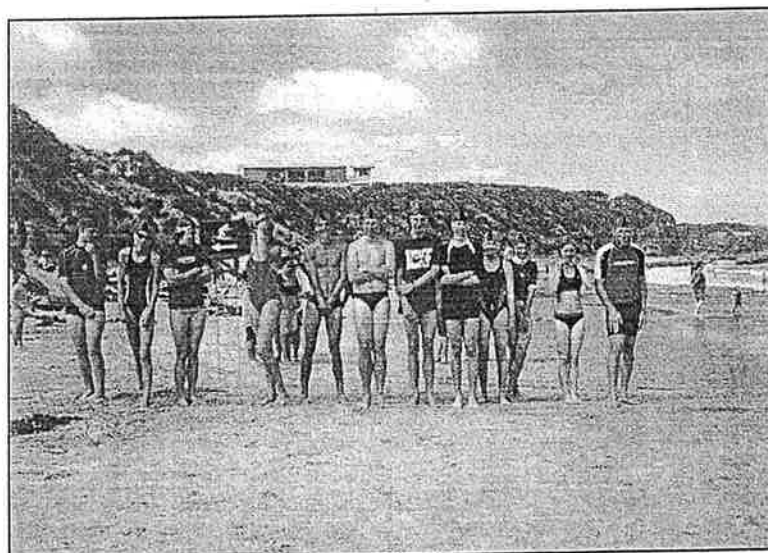

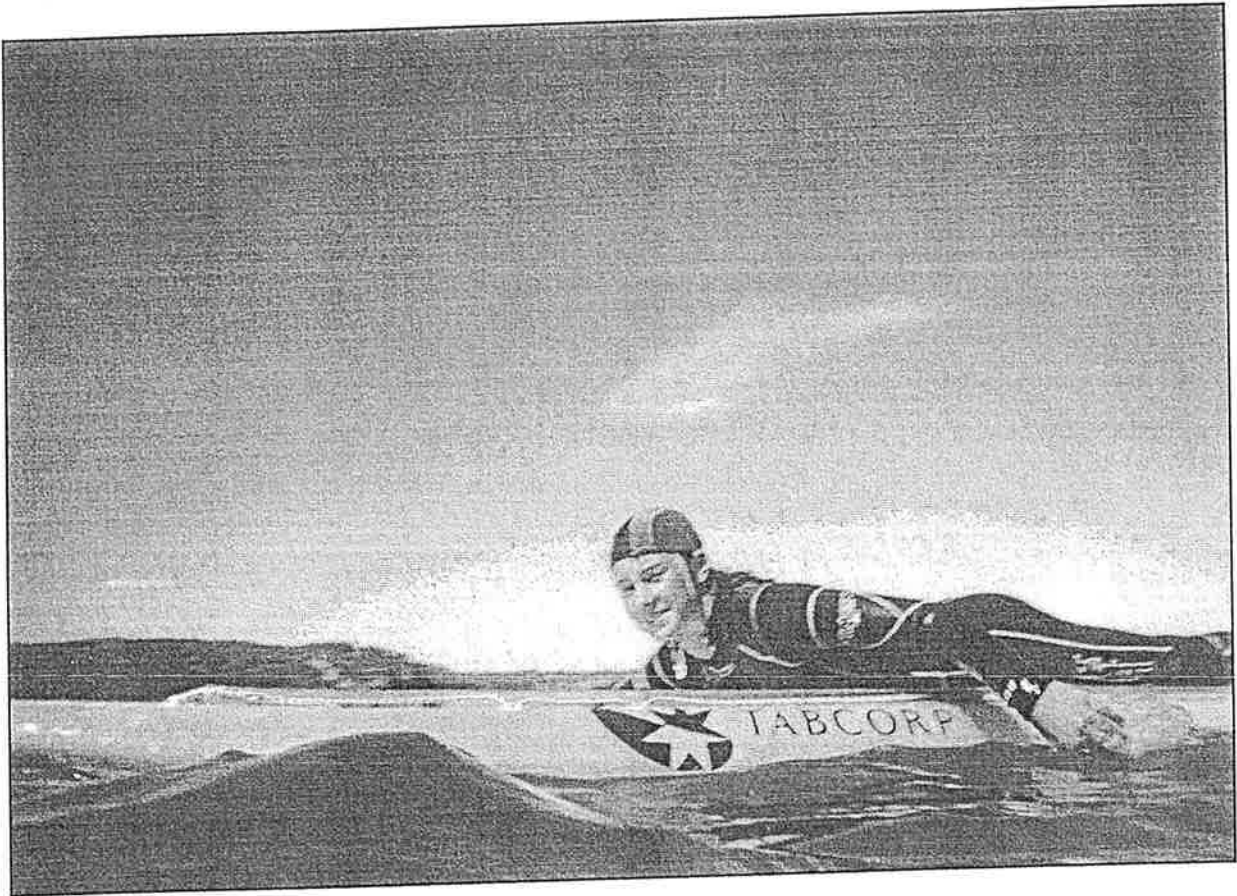
Thank you: I thank all members of the club but special thanks to a few. David Mills, I have open and frank discussions with David regularly on club business, he has been an

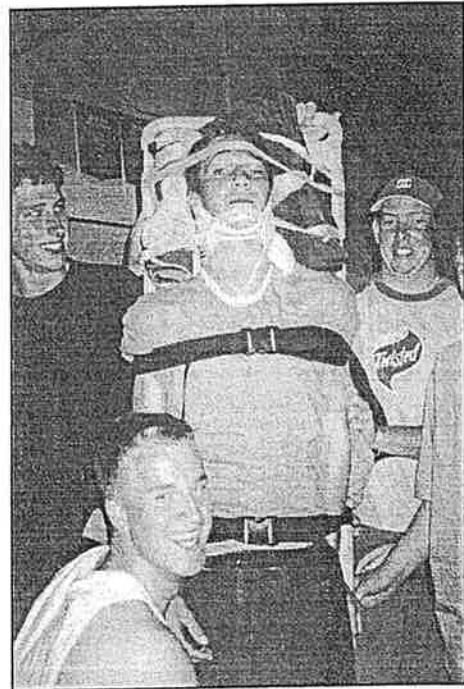

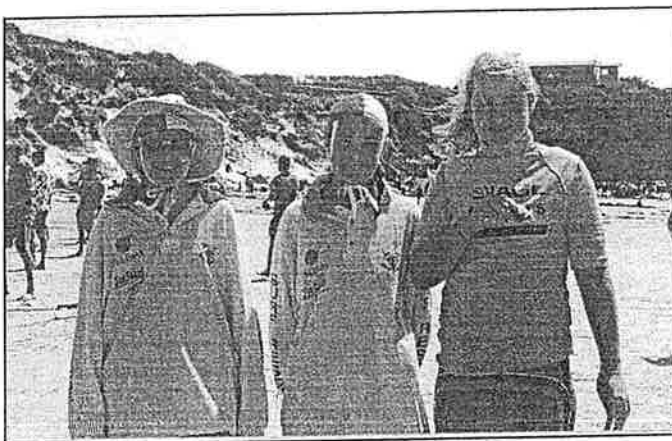

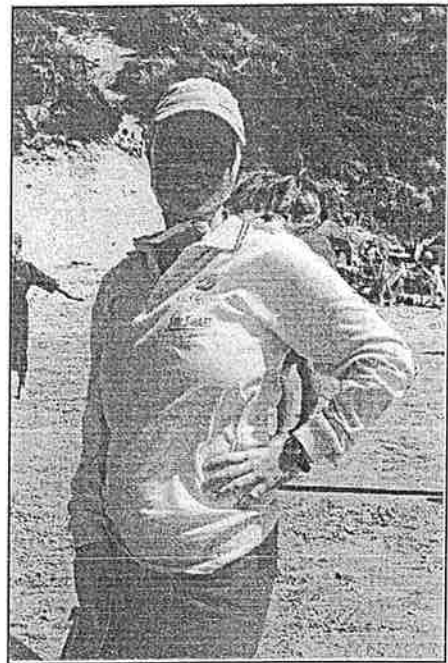

Chief Instructor – Nyree Potter

Another very busy season has passed and once again Cape Paterson SLSC has raised the standard and level of training our members receive. Season 2002 / 2003 saw our members' break last season's record of 107 awards not just by one or two or even ten or twenty awards. This year Cape Paterson SLSC members gained a total of 208 awards and trained members of the community in 14 awards, which took season 2002 / 2003's award total to 222 breaking our previous record by a whopping 115 awards.

This amount is amazing and our club and its members should be very proud of their achievements. Congratulations to everyone who gained an award and improved the standard of training our members have gained.

Season 2002 / 2003 saw the introduction of community education to our club.

Community education allows us to use the skills we have to train members of our community in water safety, resuscitation and first aid. This is an important venture for our club allowing us to be seen improving our community but also for us to use the skills we already have to fundraise.

Our involvement with the community didn't stop there Cape Paterson SLSC once again had the privilege of Kew High School and Wonthaggi Secondary College being involved in the Surf Life Saving side of the Victorian Youth Development Program.

With the commencement of the season many members completed their Senior First Aid Certificate through Kew High School and through state centre. Members also went off to train as trainers, assessors and gain Silver Medallions.

It wasn't too long before it was time to get down to business with the introduction of the new Inflatable Rescue Boat (IRB) Guidelines. Many of our current drivers and learners attended courses run by state centre prior to and during the season to up-skill their knowledge to include marine and inland navigation and rescue techniques. This course not only provided members with extra skills in IRB rescue and navigation but also provided members with the state boating license now required for Surf Life Saving IRB drivers when we were previously exempt.

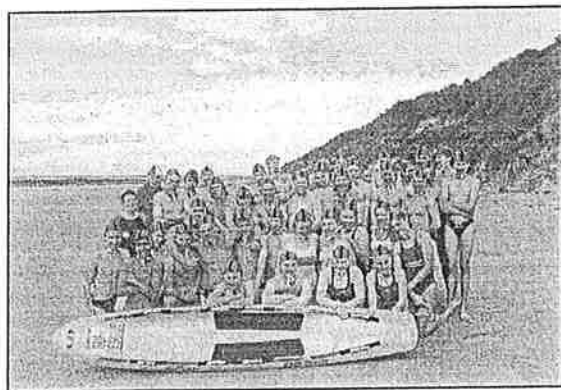


With the change in IRB regulations for Surf Life Saving requalification became a large event with all members who requalified gaining their IRB Crew Persons Certificate on the same day.





Bronze Camp was soon upon us and we had a great turn out with members joining us from as close as Wonthaggi to as far away as Queensland. With the introduction of workbooks Bronzies and SRC's had a little more work then previous years, but once again when it came to the exam day all candidates showed their true colours and passed their Bronze Medallion, Surf Rescue Certificates and Advanced Resuscitation Certificates on what was an extremely long exam day.



During the same week our Nippers presence was also felt with six nippers gaining there Basic Resuscitation Certificate. This is one of the first awards offered to members as the step up the club ranks and gradually become juniors, cadets and eventually seniors. They should be very proud of their achievements during the week.

With just over a month to recover we were back at it again for Bronze Camp number two with Kew Krew 2003. After last years group we had high expectations and we were not let down as the

club house was filled with 40 students and four teachers from Kew High School and five instructors from Cape Paterson. Fine weather was had at the start of the week but as it progressed the weather turned down but this did not deter the Krew of learning required material. All students passed to a high standard gaining their Bronze Medallion and Advanced Resuscitation Certificate.... And one Surf Rescue Certificate.

Both Bronze Camps were extremely successful and I must thank my instructors. Firstly January's camp Kendall Brown, Nathan Brown and Jess Bowman gained their Training Officers Certificate, congratulations and thank-you for your wonderful help. Special thanks go to Rob Harvey, Michael Mules and David Mills if it were not of you guys there would have been no male bunkroom open or IRB operational during January. Other thanks need to go to Dave Hawkes, Trent Doherty, Lachlan Ford, Joe Coxon, Ross Bartel, Graham Bartel, Deb Mills (Nipper Training), Andrew Main (Nipper Training), Chelsea Bowman (Nipper Training) and anyone else who helped out and I have forgotten, thanks for your time. ☺

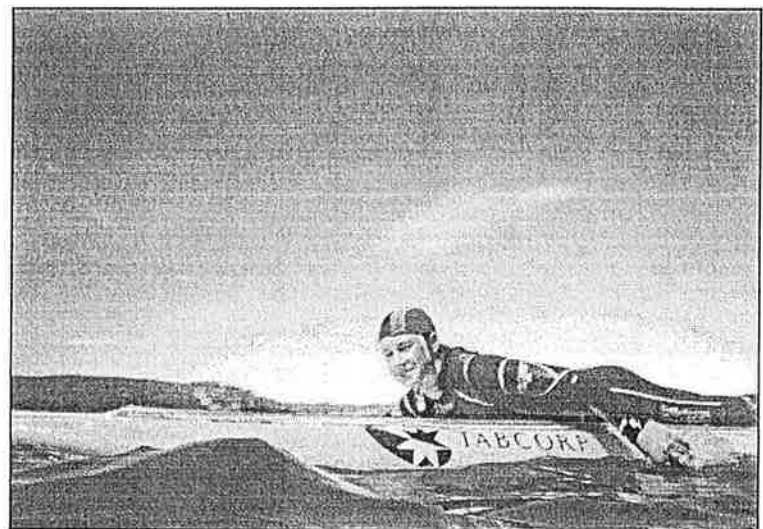
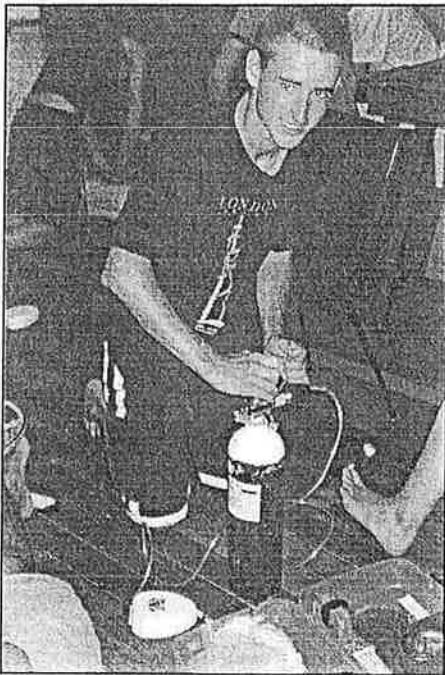


prior to and during the camp meant their students would pass to a high standard, thank you for your patients and your commitment to the course.

As Junior Club Captain I was very impressed to see the amount of juniors willing to patrol throughout the season, this is a credit to you all. Congratulations on a fine job.

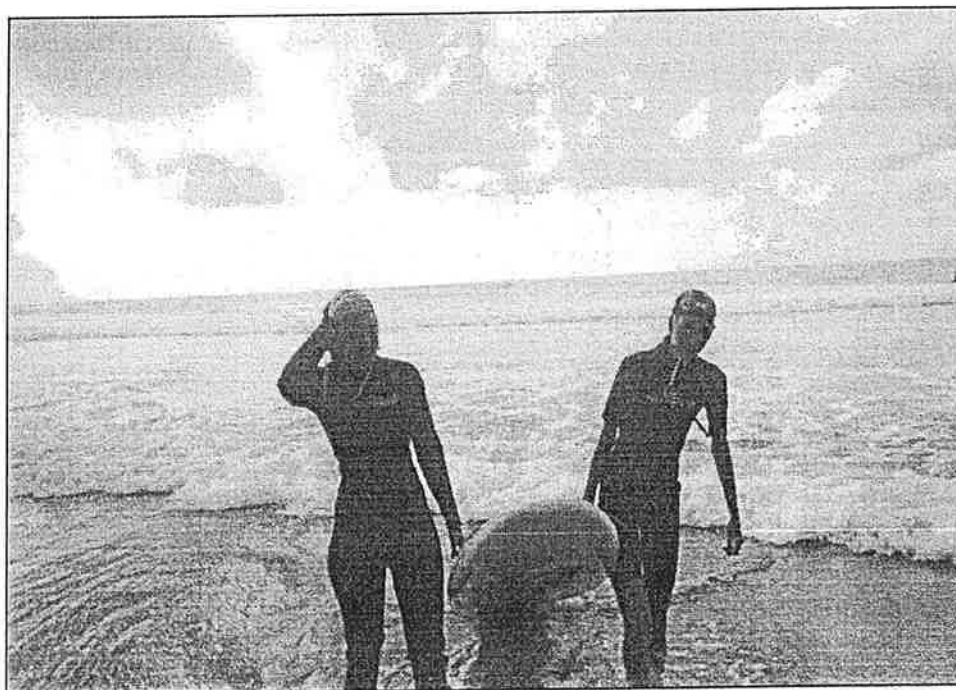

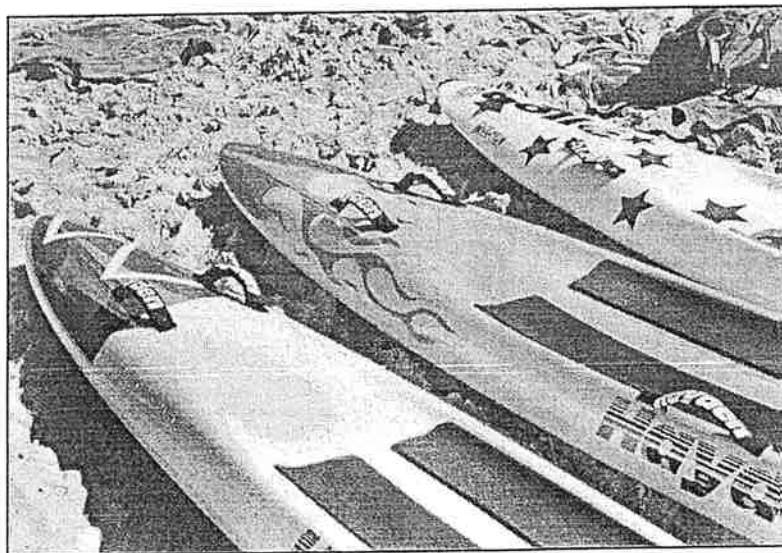
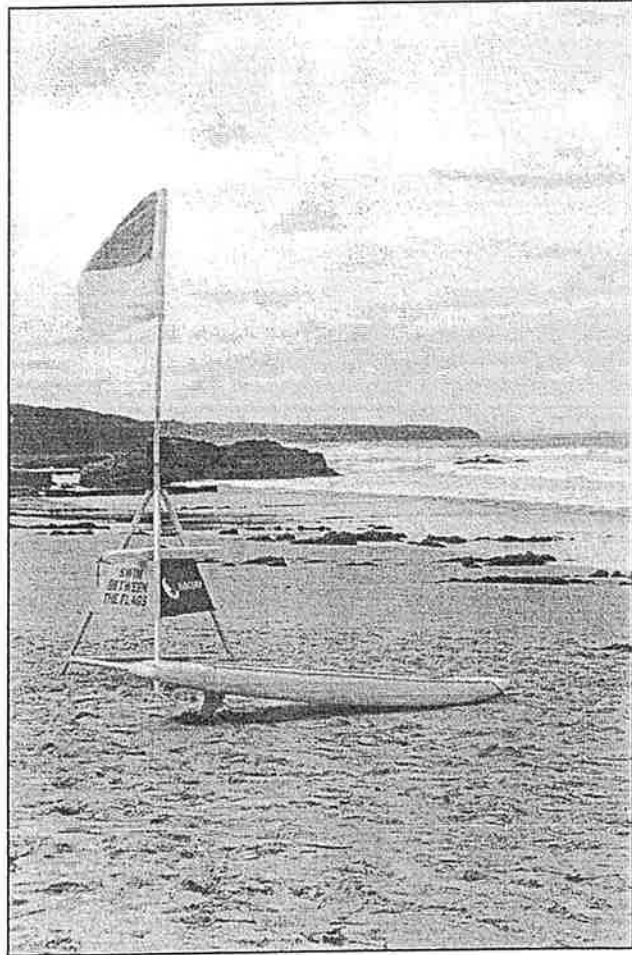




Gear Steward – Michael Mules for John Harvey

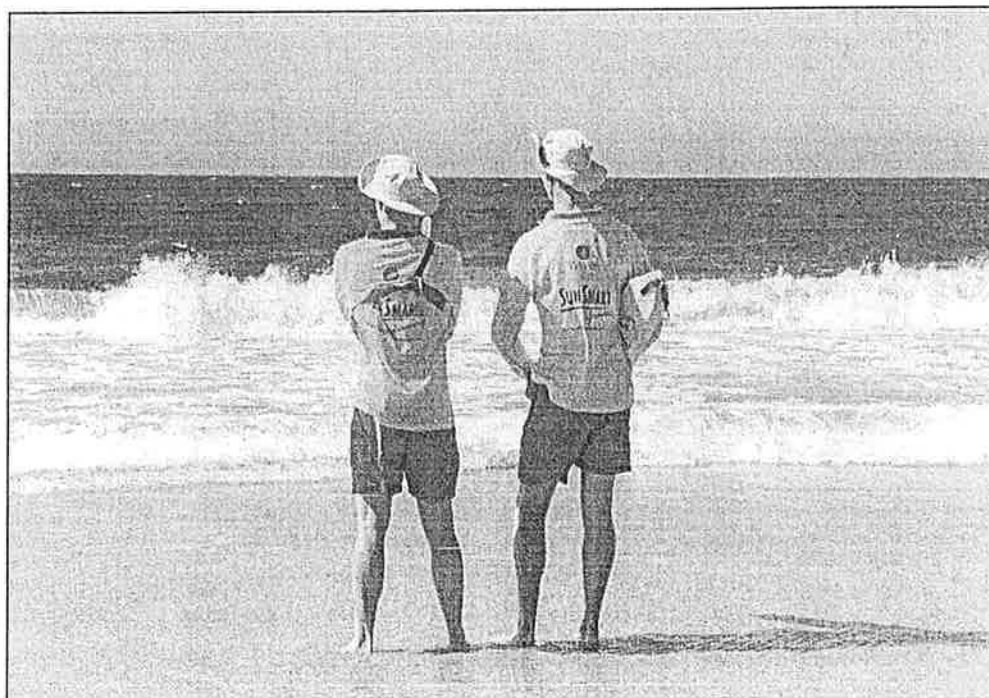


Inflatable Rescue Boat Captain – Michael Mules
