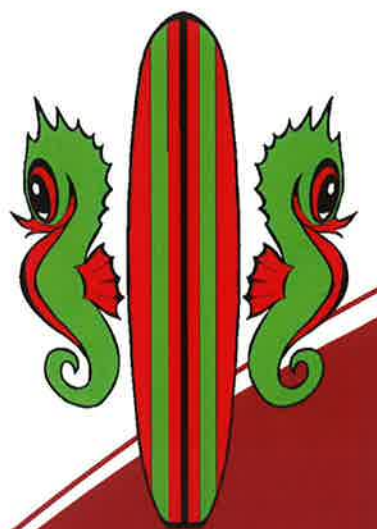

The 44th season spent patrolling Cape Paterson First Surf saw the club again successfully implement its prime objective to maintain a safe and protected environment for the swimming public. All active members train hard in the hope they will never need the skills they develop. This year again saw a range of rescues and first aid cases where our members displayed exemplary levels of skill and expertise. I am proud of the level of skill and proficiency they have. Although we maintain a totally adequate level of vigilance on our beach I was very disappointed in our result in the State Wide Patrol Competition.

Finances: The club again finished the season on a financially sound footing. We made a small profit mainly by controlling expenditure and fundraising. As always we must never take fundraising for granted. The public liability insurance premiums, with all other insurances and standard club expenses are increasing every season. We have always been dependent on the good will of people, now more so than ever for donations or time spent fundraising. Thank you very much Arthur.

Membership: Overall membership is very healthy with large numbers of junior club members and associates. We always must recruit, especially active members, to patrol the beach. The active members list is very healthy but all must pull their weight and complete their share of patrol hours so as to spread the load and support the others.

Extra Curricular Activities: The club was again involved in, or organised, a range of special events. The Aquathon as always was perfectly organised and run, and our ancillary role in the Cape Fun Run and Blue Light Disco helped maintain our profile in the local community. The club house was an outstanding location for two weddings, the spectacular view off the balcony was well utilised, and Arthur gained the title of 'Wedding Planner'.

Competition: Dave took on the role of team manager again and has started to rebuild the team. They attended a couple of carnivals but it was great to see the team fly the flag in a big way at the VICs. Alan and I again performed outstandingly and achieved a magnificent Silver Medallion at the Victorian Masters. The Club Championships need to be developed into a major club event. The number of nippers attending carnivals now is terrific and their achievements are amazing.

The club has come forward in great leaps and bounds over the last 2 decades and must continue to change and evolve as Cape Paterson itself does. I have chosen to not run for President again as there is a need for 'fresh motivated blood'. It is time for someone to drive and lead the club into its next phase of existence. Treasurer – Keith Bartel

After completing the Club-house extensions and refurbishment work of the past couple of years, the 2003/2004 year has been a relatively quiet year in terms of Club expenditures.

- Bank balance at 30 April 2004 was \$34,529. This is an increase of \$5,579 over 2003. The result is consistent with recent years where the bank balance has fluctuated around \$30,000.
- Income of \$29,587 is well down on the previous year with the club expenses commensurately lower at \$23,442
- The key area for attention is fund raising. In the past raffles, trivia nights, tin rattles and sausage sizzles have been significant fund raising events. Income from these activities was well down on last year. The standout exception was the Cape Tavern meat raffle where Arthur Phillips raised \$5,000.
- The Club again ran a Bronze camp for Wonthaggi Secondary College students. 15 students attended the December 2003 camp compared with 42 during the previous year.
- Cape Paterson surf club apparel sales are well down this year however there are stocks available. Your assistance to clear the inventory would be appreciated.
- In terms of expenses most of the club's costs are lower than last year particularly the administration (stationery, printing and postage) and clubhouse (maintenance) costs.

The financial accounts have again been audited by Cardell Accountants. Their reports are enclosed.

Finally, I would like to extend my thanks to the members for their support during the past year and to Barbara Manns for her hand-over of the treasurer's function and for her tuition in the intricacies of the club's accounting system.

As well as maintaining our clubhouse when us Melbournians can't, Arthur has managed to spearhead the new campaign to raise revenue by hiring our clubhouse for private functions. Thanks again Arthur.

There are certainly others who deserve my thanks, but no-one likes to read a thesis, so instead, a brief snapshot for the future at Cape Paterson:

The next season presents us with new challenges and opportunities. As Life Saving's role as an Emergency Service and as a Registered Training Organisation continue to grow alongside Cape Paterson's soaring land prices and community interest, so too will our Club's standards, commitment, and energy. After a fairly lack-lustre performance in terms of patrol efficiency, we will re-adopt the set-patrol model next season thus ensuring regular attendance on patrol by placing accountability back into the hands of our capable members and patrol captains.
