The Year of the Surf Lifesaver has certainly raised the profile of our active members presence every weekend between the flags and this 2006/2007 season Cape Paterson saw 120 active members complete over 2800 volunteer hours, perform multiple rescues, (even if two of them were our own members) and kept the general public safe performing thousands of preventative actions. It seems too soon to be drawing a close on a season.

We saw over 200 awards gained this season in a variety of setting from our traditional week long bronze camp to one night courses held in Melbourne, all held under the guidance of our amazing Chief Instructor Kendall. Its great to see our association with Kew High School and Wonthaggi Secondary College grow each year, thanks to the work of Kendall and his team.

It was great to see our club represented at so many levels across the state. This year Cape Paterson had;

- Five members at the Leaders in Lifesaving program - A leadership and training development scholarship for over 18 s.
- Five participants and three trainers at the Bass District Leadership Development Camp.
- Two representatives at the Training and Assessment Plenary Session.
- One participant in the Under 15 Leadership Development Camp.
- Representation at a few carnivals.

We had outstanding achievements by numerous members of our club. David Potter achieved a fourth place in the Victorian Junior Life Saver of the Year. Multiple members have been nominated for Life Saving Victoria Awards of Excellence to be announced in July, including Kendall Brown for Club Trainer of the Year and Shae

Harrop, Emily Moore, Alex Dunnachie, Luke Harrop and Elly Dunnachie who completed over 100+ patrol hours.

A big thank you goes to all the committee members who have served this year. Your devotion and countless hours have made you all highly valued members of our club this year. Thank you to:

On behalf of the Management Committee of the Cape Paterson Surf Lifesaving Club Incorporated, I submit for your consideration and adoption, the 47th Annual Report and Financial Statements covering the activities of the club for the 2006/2007 season.

The season has run smoothly with a couple of mid season transitions, which were a hiccup, but did not alter the focus of the Committee.

The committee is amazing with it's ability to function with such a diverse group of Cape Paterson Surf Lifesaving Club members. Ranging in age from 16 to 60 requires advanced communication skills to ensure everyone's point of view is valued and respected. Not everyone on the committee has a Lifesaving past but everyone is willing to learn and strive for our club.

Sponsorship remains an area that we need to concentrate on for the next season. We need to be seen by many organisations, large and small, as viable to sponsor not the few that we currently depend upon.

I would like to thank all of the supporters of the club, as their words of encouragement ensure that all of the work been undertaken behind the scenes is important to all, not just the active members.

Thankyou to all of the committee and even though we have a few moving to alternative positions or not renewing, I look forward to another constructive season. I cannot say the job gets easier the longer you are in it, but possibly it makes more sense.

Treasurer – Keith Bartel

The audited accounts of the Club for the past financial year are attached. The bank balance at 30 April 2007 was \$19,622 with a further \$10,282 in a 6 month Westpac term deposit at 6.5%. This term deposit matures on 25 June 2007 and the plan is to roll it over for another 6 month period.

At the 2006 AGM I mentioned the costs of running the Club were increasing and that greater effort had to be put into fund raising and the control of expenses. The income generated by the Club has increased over the past year by 45% to \$68,763. The increases have been achieved through donations/grants and fund raising. There has been little real change in Club expenses.

Financial highlights of the past year:

- **Donations & Grants.** The Club was successful in applying for and receiving grant funding from (i) Volunteer Small Equipment Grants \$2536 for Beach Marquees, (ii) Envirofund \$2650 for fencing and (iii) a Beach Cleaning Subsidy of \$2390. In addition, refunds of \$16232 were received under the Community Safety Emergency Support Program for equipment upgrades. Donations increased from \$574 to \$5656.
- **Functions & Fundraising.** Fundraising continues to be a key area of the Club activities. Through member support of the Blue Light Disco, Cape Aquathon, and the Classical Cape concert, the Club raised over \$4800. Arthur Phillips conducted the weekly Cape Tavern raffles raising \$4000 and Nancy Phillips hosted the Mulwala pokie trip raising \$600. The 'Tin Rattles', the Camberwell Safeway and Cape Paterson sausage sizzles, the Trivia night and the Easter egg hunt are all a significant source of income totalling over \$8000.
- **Bronze Camps.** The Bronze camps contribute to both the Club's income and expenditure. The Club ran three (four last year) Bronze/Life Saving Certificate courses for Kew High School, Wonthaggi Secondary College and our own Club camp. Kendall



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Brown organised the courses with training provided by Club members.

- Insurance costs. Insurance is a major expense that is not accurately reflected in this year's expenses. A comparison with last year is Difficult. Two 'Public Liability' payments were made within the 2005/6 period, while this year the building and equipment insurance has slipped into the 2007/8 financial year. A more accurate insurance expense would be ~\$8000.

The Club recorded a significant surplus of \$26,124 for the year following the small deficit recorded last year. If we wish to hold down member's subscription rates, then there must be a sustained focus on fund-raising, the applications for grant funding and the active participation of the membership in Club activities.

The financial accounts have been audited by Cardell Accountants, Wonthaggi.

Here we are again, at the end of another season. And what a season!! Over 2800 lifesaver hours were performed by our magnificent team! Congratulations and thankyou to everyone who performed any of these hours. You are all fantastic!

For some of us, the season was underway well before the first weekend of patrols in late November. All our gear was checked, repaired and scrutinised before Kendall and his team fired up the first bronze camp of the season – Kew High School. At the end of their camp about 25 Kew High students were deemed fit enough to join our polished squad of patrolling members, including some from Wonthaggi Secondary College, to help push our total patrol list to more than 120 people.

December was its usual self: Slightly-colder-than-ideal-but-better-than-August. But this year it was slightly more exciting. Our newly appointed Team Manager, Sam Murphy, hit the ground running and had a squad ready for the first senior carnival of the season – Woolamai on 17 December. Using a combination of new blood from Kew High and some older blood that just needed the right motivation, not only did we compete but we even won an event! The under 19 girl's beach relay team came first in their event. Other incredible performances are Paul Walter (2nd in U17 beach sprint, 3rd in U19) and Alex Dunnachie (3rd in U17 beach sprint).

Held the night before the Woolamai carnival was the Cape Paterson SLSC Christmas party organised by Rohan Phillips and Sam Murphy. Those that attended had a great time dancing the night away to the '80 s gold that was pumping from the juke box. There were a few tired faces the next morning, sorry afternoon. Imagine the competition results if the Christmas party wasn't held .

A group of our finest lifesavers put their entrepreneurial skills to the test by cooking a recovery breakfast for sale to the public on the morning of 1 January 2007. Disguising their own sore heads

they raised well over \$400 selling bacon and egg sandwiches in the first fundraising effort of the season. This is a great effort considering most wouldn't think of getting up before midday!

Sunday 7 January saw a ragtag bunch of wide eyed hopefuls enter the club house for the 2007 edition of Bronze Camp, again hosted by our chief instructor, Kendall Brown. As usual, Kendall was greatly assisted by a dedicated group of assistants who made this year's camp as fun as ever! Little under a week later a group of highly trained & motivated lifesavers left the camp and joined our patrols, causing our patrolling members to number over 150!!

Many would think the Bronze medallion is enough to teach in one week, but not Kendall. Over Wednesday and Thursday nights during the week, the Patrol Captain Silver Medallion was taught as well as the defibrillator operator's course, both were well attended by our members.

During the season, a number of fund raising activities occurred. The most famous, and highest earning, of which is the Friday night Chook raffle run almost single handedly by Arthur Phillips at the Cape Tavern. This raffle raises thousands of dollars for the club each year so a simple thankyou hardly suffices for the amount of effort put in. Thank you also to Kenny Webster, the publican at the Tavern (but as if I had to tell you), for allowing us to hold the raffle at the pub.

Another significant fund raiser for the club are our Tin Rattles. Three were held throughout the season and two things didn't change at any of them. Firstly, it is the easiest way to raise a few thousand dollars, secondly, girls outperform boy, by a lot. A couple of notable performances were Emily Moore who raised over \$200 in a few hours around Wonthaggi and Elly Dunnachie who raised ~\$350 over a two sessions, again in Wonthaggi. Of course, some people have better positions than others so I'd like to thank everyone who took part in any of our fund raising activities. It all helps.

The week following our Bronze Camp, five of our lifesavers attended the Bass District Leadership Development Camp as

students and a few more as instructors / water safety, etc. Like all lifesaving camps, this group had an incredible time with some people earning five awards during the week!! I highly recommend putting your hand up to attend one of these camps next season.

All through January a strange phenomenon occurs. Every Saturday, Sunday and Wednesday morning the beach is overrun by 7 to 12 year old Nippers learning the skills required to become our lifesavers. This season Caroline Egan and Tracy McDonald ran the nippers programme with the help of some parents and a dedicated team of lifesavers helping in the water. This is one of the most important jobs in the club as it ensures we have enough kids coming up to become lifesavers. And the kids love it!! Thank you to Tracy and Caroline for running the programme this year. You have done a great job.

As far as lifesaving goes, I would like to mention a few people who were outstanding this season. Five people patrolled for more than 100 hours during the season. They were Shae Harrop, Emily Moore, Alex Dunnachie, Luke Harrop and Elly Dunnachie. The patrol hours page gives a breakdown of the actual number of hours patrolled. A special mention needs to go to Luke Harrop who only completed his Bronze at the club Bronze Camp in January. This means he has had about six weeks less time than everyone else but has still patrolled for 107.25 hours. Amazing. Thank you all.

I would also like to thank the Committee for a productive year at the club as well as all our patrolling members. You have all been great. But finally, I would like to thank the three other patrol captains – Rohan Phillips, Sam Murphy and Kendall Brown. The effort you have put in has made my job so much easier.

Chief Instructor – Kendall Brown

Well what a season, is the first thing that comes to mind when reflecting on my time down at Cape this year, with over 130 awards being awarded throughout the course of the season. Not all of these awards were gained on the golden beaches of Cape Paterson as this year has seen the first Cape Paterson member in a long time gain their Gold medallion. Congratulations go out to Timmy Luszczak for completing the gruelling five day Gold camp at Lorne.

This year also saw five members attend the inaugural Bass District Life Saving Development Camp at Waratah Beach SLSC where they completed awards in ARC, First Aid, Defib and IRB Crew. These camps will become increasingly important in the development of our life savers and will lead into advanced life saving awards.

As all ways the Life Saving year kicked off in mid November with the club house being filled with 20 Kew High School students. This was also the time there was snow on the beach of Lorne, making it one of the coldest bronze camps Doogs can remember (with the amount of years Doogs has been around it must have been cold) I'm sure some of the Kew kids are still trying to get warm from there swims.

The next camp to be run was the club camp in January which, to the pleasure of all the Kew High instructors, was nice and hot. This camp was a little bit different from other years, this year the camp was not just a bronze camp it was also an ARC, Silver Medallion (Patrol Captain) and Defib camp, so some of our new Bronzies came out with four awards. So after the week was done and we added up all the awards 83 were achieved throughout the week. Special thanks goes to Nyree for running the Defib and Patrol Captain's courses and also to Jess Bowman for running the ARC. It was also good to see for once we didn't need to send any candidates to hospital, we instead opted to send one of the public on a trip to hospital, in the back of an ambulance.

The last step of the year was the annual Wonthaggi Secondary College Bronze camp, which as always was a fun camp, with Sam Murphy leading the kids through the sand dunes to teach the kids radio procedures. As always there was a steady stream of parent's cars through the camp delivering some of the best food to be eaten at the club all year (all pre cooked at home ofcourse).

On a final note I would just like to thank every one for their help and support over the least two years. I have decided to not run as Chief Instructor due to my move into the real world of work and not having the ability to commit to the time intensive role of chief instructor. Very special thanks goes out to Nyree, Jess B, Sam M, Rohan, Greg M, Emily, Chelsea B, Dan B and Doogs, if it wasn't for you guys the camps would not be able to go ahead. Thanks also to all the water safety
