Jess well done in your first year as Chief Instructor, your "no fuss, get on with the job, nothing is going to phase this little black duck" work ethic is refreshing and a credit to you.

Nippers this year has been sensational. Tracy I commend you on your organization, enthusiasm, drive, patience and above all else your ability with a whistle. 93 nippers plus parents silenced and under control with one earsplitting blow of the prized whistle – a skill to be envied!!

Thanks also to the team of age managers that Tracy recruited. Even with the "whistle" it is not possible for one person to manage a successful program with 93 nippers and without you it would not have gone off with the successful bang that it did.

It was great to see more members getting into competition this year. The training sessions Sam and Millsy organized were excellent – seeing in excess of 10 members training on malibu's regularly was an awesome sight and the challenge now will be to build on that momentum. Well done Sam.

And a BRONZE at the Vic's – SENSATIONAL!!! Well done Sarah and all who competed during the season!



This season saw some great fundraising events:

- The Wonthaggi Tin Rattle in January showed us how easy it is for 8-10 people to raise over \$2000 in a morning, followed up with hitting the streets around Cape later in the season for a further \$400-500 was well worthwhile. It should also be noted that these events also have an added benefit of lifting our profile in the community.
- The Trivia Night was a our best yet financially (over \$3000) and was a very successful “fun”raiser as well. Thanks to Kirsty Manns for stepping in to take the lead with this and making it a great night.
- The Easter Egg Hunt continues to build each year with numbers attending this years hunt double that of last year.
- Hall Hire is a somewhat untapped fundraiser and has potential to generate more income for the club.
- The Cape Tavern Raffles remain one of our major sources of income and Arthur we say it every year but it needs to be said again and again and again – thank you, we all appreciate your efforts here.

We already have 2 volunteers for a “Fundraising Committee” for the coming year which is very encouraging.

The Cape Aquathon is very quickly becoming our premier public event. This year it attracted over 180 competitors and was a huge success. The success of the event is almost entirely due to the efforts of a small group of people – Arthur, Nancye, Karen, Simon and Robyn. As it has for the 11 previous years the event went off like clockwork with Karen, Robyn, Chris and team managing the pre race administration, Simon quietly working up a sweat with his “man power” team doing the hard labour and Arthur organizing the fantastic group of over 50 volunteers that help make the event a success. The Aquathon continues to grow each year and has huge financial and profile potential for the club. Moving forward this poses a challenge for us as a club to recruit and extend the organizing committee beyond this small family based team. This will be a focus in the coming year.

In 2010 we will have our 50th anniversary and we will be recruiting for an organising committee from the “fossil” era and the newer generations to organise the celebrations.

This season we have encouraged everyone on the committee to set themselves (or their position) longer term goals for the next 12 months and beyond to give focus and a common direction. Some have been met and some are ongoing.

# treasurer's report

The bank balance at 30 April 2008 was \$40,000. The Club holds a further \$11,718 in a 6 month Westpac term deposit at 6.9%. This term deposit matured on 26 May 2008 and rolled over for a further 6 month period.

The annual Cape Aquathon is growing in size and reputation and is now fully sponsored by the Club. The Cape Aquathon committee made a \$5,000 donation to the Club.

The total income for the year was \$64,500 while expenses were \$41,500 leaving a surplus for the 2007/8 season of \$23,000.

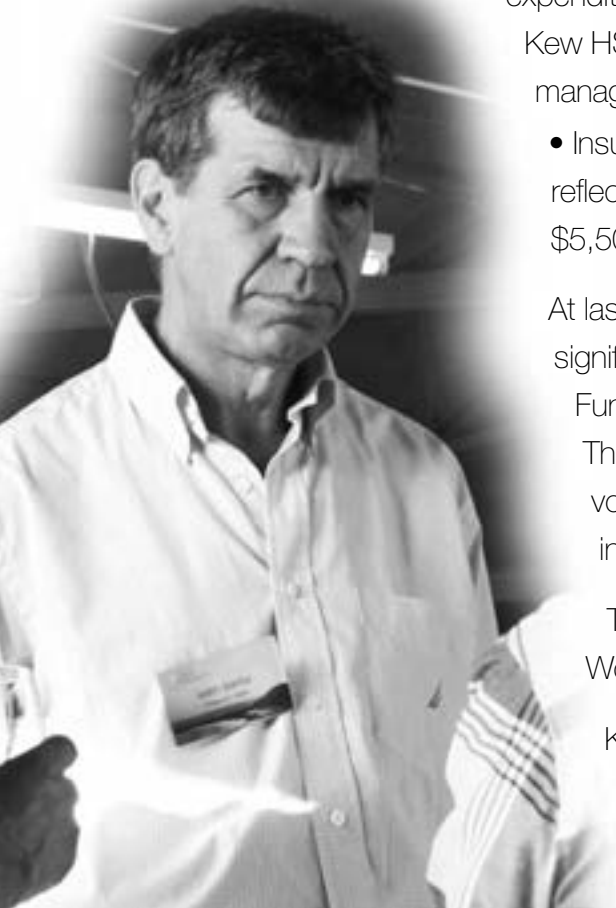
Financial highlights of the past year:

- Membership Subscriptions. Nipper group numbers (~100) was the standout feature of Club membership increase over the past year. Subscription fees totalled approx. \$7,800.
- Donations, Grants & Sponsorships. Donations, grants and sponsorships contributes over a third of Club income. It is critical to the financial viability of the Club. The Cape Aquathon donation and a \$3,000 sponsorship from Stockdale & Leggo were major contributors. The Club received a Beach Cleaning Subsidy of \$2,590.
- Functions & Fundraising. Fundraising continues to be a key area of the Club activities. Throughout the year Arthur Phillips conducted the Friday evening Cape Tavern raffle, with club members running an extra raffle on Saturday nights during the peak season, these raised \$6,000. Nancy Phillips again hosted the fun trips to NSW. The Trivia night brought in an amazing \$3,000. Door knocks and tin rattles provided another significant contribution and the Easter egg hunt continues to grow and therefore the income grows.
  - Bronze Camps. The Bronze camps contribute to both the Club's income and expenditure. The Club ran three Bronze/Life Saving Certificate courses for Kew HS, Wonthaggi SC and our own Club camp. The courses were all managed and the training provided by Club members.
    - Insurance costs. Insurance is a major expense that is not accurately reflected in this year's expenses. Insurance expenses are inflated by \$5,500 this year due to two premiums falling in the 2007/8 season.

At last year's AGM I mentioned the costs of running the Club were significant. Expenses have not got any less during the past 12 months. Fundraising is a critical activity which should involve all Club members. The 2008/9 summer season needs to involve increased members volunteering to assist with sausage sizzles, door knocks and tin rattles in Cape Paterson and Wonthaggi.

The financial accounts have been audited by Cardell Accountants, Wonthaggi.

We have had another very successful season of training and assessment at Cape Paterson.

We ran three Bronze Camps, with record numbers of 34 participants at the club camp in January. Cape Paterson members have gained a total of 145 awards throughout the season including: 63 Bronze Medallions, 17 Surf Rescue Certificates, 22 Advanced Resuscitation Certificates, 15 Resuscitation Certificates, 1 Radio, 2 Silver Medallion IRB Drivers, 7 IRB Crew Certificates, 5 Spinal Management Certificates, 4 Defibrillation Certificates, 4 First Aid Certificates, 3 Certificate IVs in Training & Assessment and 3 Gold Medallions!

Thank you to everyone who helped out with training and assessment throughout the season - from running a session at a Bronze Camp, water safety, cooking BBQs or providing comic relief- it is all greatly appreciated!

Highlights of the season include:

- Doogs losing 7 litres of fake blood during a scenario at the Kew High Bronze Camp (the human body only has around 4 litres of blood!)
- Sam Adam and Jac Jak performing their rendition of 'You've Lost That Loving Feeling' during the Bronzelow awards night in January
- Scott McGill and myself trying to re-right the IRB during a training roll-over at the Wonthaggi Bronze Camp, failing, and slipping off the IRB hull back into the water, to the amusement of all spectators.
- Brendan Hamilton and Fraser Rowley performing a text-book perfect patient assessment and CPR on the exam day at the January Bronze Camp
- Mid Week Games night during the January Bronze Camp, with parents joining in the fun of beach relays and flags.
