On behalf of the Management Committee of the Cape Paterson Surf Lifesaving Club Incorporated, I submit for your consideration and adoption, the 49th Annual Report and Financial Statements covering the activities of the club, for the 2008/2009 season.

The Annual General meeting for last season seems a long time ago, but the feeling of honor that was bestowed upon me when being awarded Life Membership with the Cape Paterson Surf Lifesaving Club remains with me. My involvement with our Club will not alter and I have enjoyed this year in my role of Secretary. The other concurrent position I hold as the clubs Public Advocate, has been called in to use a couple of times over the season and this has allowed me to be involved in another capacity which has given me the opportunity to learn new skills.

The role of Secretary is not just attending meetings and producing the minutes, it requires advanced communication and negotiation skills and these are at times tested, but I enjoy the role and hope to continue into the future. The secretary has a voice in decision making, with support from the Administrative and Active sections of the Committee and this forces me to remain aware and up to date with current trends and activities. As I do not have a vested interest in any of the age groups or activities, I can maintain an unbiased view through fundraising, fund allocation and other administrative areas.

Beyond my elected position, I extend myself to training and assessing Nippers and Bronze Medallion candidates in First Aid. This I do for pleasure, as I see the growth in these groups and their thirst for knowledge. During this time I meet parents and supporters of the club and have seen an increased interest over the season from all parties.

I look forward to another season in this role and the continued involvement in all other activities, from cleaning to cooking and beyond.

treasurer

The bank balance at 30 April 2009 was \$25,000. The Club holds a further \$59000 in 4 short term (less than 12 months) term deposits at both the Westpac and Bendigo banks.

The income was \$87,700 while expenses were \$56,700 leaving a surplus for the 2008/9 season of \$31,000.

Financial highlights of the past year:

Income. Club income increased by \$20,000 over the previous financial year. While all income categories recorded an increase, the principle contributors were 'Donations/Grants/Sponsorships', Bronze camps, Fundraising and Memberships.

- Donations, Grants & Sponsorships. Donations, grants and sponsorships contribute over 30% of Club income. It is critical to the financial viability of the Club. The Cape Aquathon \$5,000 donation and a \$3,000 sponsorship from Stockdale & Leggo were major contributors. The Lions Club of Cape Paterson donated \$660 towards a defibrillator training unit for the Club. Other grants include VicHealth \$2750, DHL \$550, LSV Admin Grants \$2500 and Victorian Government \$6750, through the Community Safety Emergency Support Program.
- Bronze Camps. The Bronze camps contribute to both the Club's income and expenditure. The Club ran three Bronze/Life Saving Certificate courses for Kew HS, Wonthaggi SC and our own Club camp. Jess Bowman managed the courses with training provided by Club members.
- Functions & Fundraising. Fundraising continues to be a key area of the Club activities. Throughout the year Arthur Phillips conducted the Friday evening Cape Tavern raffle supported by Club members who ran the Saturday raffle during the summer season to raise \$6,700. The Trivia night brought in \$2,600. Tin rattles \$2,600, Doog's Snail race \$655, Easter Egg hunt \$234 and the Sausage sizzles, Club breakfasts and BBQs \$1400, are all significant sources of income.
- Membership Subscriptions. Last year the Club registered 384 financial members. Nipper group numbers (~100) was the standout feature of the Club membership increase. Subscription fees totalled approx. \$11,000.

Expenses increased by \$4,700 over last season. Other than for Training costs which have doubled, there are no significant increases in expenses. Over the past 5 years, operating expenses have doubled from \$23,400 to \$56,700, an average increase of ~\$6,000 per year. While income has kept pace with expenses, the costs associated with running the Club are significant. Fundraising is a critical activity which must involve all Club

Some highlights of the season:



The gear inspection was also made much simpler by the addition of a new patrol shelter. This was the first new shelter for our club for many years and has the benefits of being bigger and more visible on the beach but also easier and quicker to erect than the previous shelter.

Towards the end of the season we welcomed the arrival of 5 new nipper boards. These boards are top of the line for nipper competition so hopefully our legions of nippers will not only win board races next season but look good doing so!
