It is very sad that we announce the passing away of John Cantwell Senior. Most of you would not know of him as any more than a name on the honour boards in the club house. John would have to be one of the most important Presidents that ever served The Club.

Officially John was President from 1980 to 1986, 6 seasons, but this does not reflect the years before this period where John was a long serving committee member, team manager, towing the gear trailer all over Victoria, he roped in his wife Yvonne to be club registrar leading her to become secretary. His sons John, Tom, David and daughter Anne all held major positions of responsibility and so through the late 70's and early 80's the Cantwell's influence was everywhere.

Many of you don't know the history of the club through season 1979/80 but it was one of turmoil. We finished the season with 4 active members, John Cantwell (junior), Mark Legg (Doogs), Alan Taylor and myself. We had no money in the bank; in fact we owed what in those days was a large amount of money to Cordon homes. We had put the floor in upstairs and built the first balcony, but couldn't pay for it. We defaulted the last patrols of season 79/80. It is not a proud time for our surf life saving club and we were close to folding up.

At the next AGM John agreed to take on the Presidency of this basket case of a club. He was originally a Wonthaggi boy and had grown up in the town. His contacts and network in the area were invaluable to the survival of the club. He used his personal reputation to guarantee the money we owed and then set out to organise the fundraising required. He built over the next few seasons a powerful committee with outstanding people such as Arthur Phillips and Bryan Baulch who lead us through these trials. John was terrific as he left the patrolling side of the club to be run by the Club Captain with very little interference. He was always supportive of our requests for gear even though money was very tight. His personal charisma and outstanding diplomacy allowed him to build a highly supportive network amongst the Bass Coast clubs as well as State Centre officials. We were loaned resources and given carnivals to run all designed to support our ailing club.

We can credit John Cantwell Senior in laying the substantive foundation that has built into the current strong and prosperous club we enjoy today.

Our 50th season was certainly a busy one and the Gala 50th Celebrations on the Australia Day weekend being the highlight of the season. It was a great night (weekend) with over 160 present, past and even a couple of future members there to celebrate, we welcomed home some of our founding members including Les Legg, Ron Gilmour and John and Cyril Panozzo and our first president Wally Purvis. This event would not have been possible if not for the efforts of the committee and the 50th organising team – Tracy, Wendy, Peter and Jazz thanks so much for all your hard work.

On the business of Surf Life Saving we had a busy season too.

This season we trialed a couple of new initiatives with the structure and management of our patrols. The "Beach Operations Committee" (BOC) was formed (set after much discussion of names, my favourite was Beach Operations Group! – and yes it's a Dad joke) and included the Club Cpt, Vice Club Cpt and Patrol Cpt's. This group was charged with the responsibility of ensuring we met our patrolling commitments over the season. We also introduced the "Patroller of the Month" to recognise patrollers that went above and beyond, deciding the recipient was also BOC's responsibility.



The success of BOC, patrols and the active side of the club in general this season was directly due to the leadership team. Jess Bowman (Club Cpt), Darcy Manks (Vice Club Cpt), Chelsea Bowman (Chief Inst) and Mark "Doogs" Legg (IRB Cpt). You guys shone in your roles - not only managing the beach and patrol responsibilities but also leading and encouraged a strong, healthy, welcoming club culture. Well done.

Training and Assessment was again a huge part of our club and Chelsea you should be congratulated for your efforts here. 4 bronze camps and over 100 new lifesavers, an IRB camp, over 120 hours on patrol, Patrol Cpt and much more. Cape was also represented at external training courses extensively. Magnificent effort Chels keep up the great work, bigger and better! You have certainly set the bar high for next season!

Twice this season our members were called on to render assistance in critical situations; both incidents occurred towards the eastern end of firsts surf. On Australia Day we rescued a gentleman who had been dumped and required resuscitation and a then a couple of weeks after the end of season an elderly gentleman was rescued. Both were transported by helicopter to hospital. Unfortunately one of the patients later passed away due to complications from his injuries and pre-injury conditions, the other patient suffered permanent spinal injuries but due to our members and their assistance rendered he is still alive.

The club does not just run on the beach though, there are many hours dedicated to the administrative tasks, fundraising, grant submissions and much more. To Francis, Wendy and Keith as always your support, council and dedication is greatly appreciated and often goes "under the radar", thank you. To David B., Barbara and David P. thank you also for your support and involvement in the committee.

Cash and Short Term Deposits

The bank balance at 30 April 2010 was \$37,900. The Club holds a further \$61000 in 4 short term (less than 12 months) term deposits at both the Westpac and Bendigo banks.

Income

The income for the 2009/2010 season was \$100,300 while expenses were \$69,800 leaving a surplus for the season of \$30,500.

Less than \$10,000 of this income was funded directly through Lifesaving Victoria. The Club has maintained a strong emphasis on income generation throughout the year, in order to support the lifesaving and beach patrolling activities of the Club.



We were successful with 5 grant applications;

1. Federal Govt. Volunteers Grant \$2500 – Public Address equipment
2. Community Safety, Emergency Support Program \$17000 – IRB and Motor
3. Sporting Uniforms Grant \$1100 – Patrol Uniforms
4. Bass Coast Shire Community Grants \$1200 – Upgrade Clubhouse Security.
5. Safeway/Woolworths Community Grant \$3600.

Clubhouse functions during the year grossed over \$10,000.

These functions included the 50th Anniversary dinner, the Trivia night, Doog's Snail race, the Easter-egg hunt, several club breakfasts and BBQs as well as hiring out the hall for weddings and anniversaries.

Arthur Phillips has continued to run the Friday evening raffle at the Cape Tavern throughout the year to raise \$7000.

The lifesavers manned sausage sizzle stalls at Cranbourne Bunnings and Wonthaggi Safeway and participated in the annual Wonthaggi tin rattle to raise \$3500.

Chelsea Bowman co-ordinated 4 Bronze camps over the summer for Club members as well as students from Kew, Kooweerup and Wonthaggi High Schools all of whom became

club members. Over 30 participants attended each Bronze camp. The camps covered all costs for IRB expenses, replacement of consumables, tuition of trainers and fees for the external assessors.

The Committee has focused on developing sponsorships with local businesses. Stockdale and Leggo, Safeway and Westpac have all contributed to the Club.

Significant donations have been received from the Rate Payers Association, the local Lions Clubs, Wonthaggi IGA store and from the memorial service for Anne Wills, a former club member who passed away last December.

On-line Banking

During the year the Club participated with Surf Life Saving Australia to introduce the SurfGuard payment gateway. This facility provides a secure and very low cost method for all Club members to pay their subscriptions, bronze camp fees, apparel sales, social events or donations. I would encourage all members to use the system.

This year I will be discussing on-line payments with Westpac. An increasing number of our suppliers have indicated a preference for electronic payment for goods and services to the Club.

club captain's report

2009/2010 was a very strong season for the active side of the Club, and a fantastic way to mark 50 years of patrolling at Cape Paterson. Across the season, patrol attendance was very good, with more than minimum patrol (4 people) on duty even during the low season (March- April when its cold and wet!). There were several outstanding patrollers this season, including Jake Hedley, who patrolled almost every weekend without fail, tallying an amazing 189.5 hours for the season! In second place for highest number of patrol hours was Chelsea Bowman, who not only ran 4 Bronze Camps and an IRB camp as Chief Instructor but also lead by example as patrol captain, completing an impressive 120.75 hours of patrol without losing her sense of humour! Also worthy of mention is Doogs (Mark Legg) who exceeds expectations every year in the time and energy he devotes to the Club. In addition to being a very diligent IRB Captain, Doogs patrolled most weekends (94.5 hours for the season), putting some enthusiastic new IRB crew and drivers through the paces. There were many others who completed between 50 and 100 patrolling hours, which is a fantastic effort. Overall as a Club we patrolled an amazing 3692.5 hours for the season! Thank you to all active lifesavers for the time and effort you put in to patrols and all the fun along the fun!

This season we introduced a new sub-committee, BOC (Beach Operations Committee), made up of the 4 Patrol Captains (Chelsea, Jacinta Early, Darcy Manks and Dave Potter) and myself, to organise people and equipment for patrols. Among others responsibilities, BOC was charged with nominating a 'Patroller of the Month' for each month of the lifesaving season, recognising individuals who had given outstanding service to the Club. Patrollers of the Month were:

- December: Jake Hedley
- January: Steph Kelly
- February: Em Rogers
- March: Casey Almarker

We had two near-drownings at Cape this season, one resuscitation on Australia Day and one in April after the end of the official lifesaving period. In both incidents, the patients were conscious and breathing by the time paramedics arrived, thanks to the efforts of the lifesavers on duty. Both LSV staff and the Regional Officer for Bass were very impressed with the professionalism with which the Cape Pat lifesavers handled the incidents. The lifesavers involved were quick to respond,

acted in accordance with training and most importantly worked as a team. It is one thing to complete lifesaving training but quite another to put that training into practice in an emergency situation. Our response to both incidents is a credit to all active lifesavers at Cape.

The season finished on a very high note, with a really enjoyable Easter weekend: 4 great patrols, a Trivia Night on the Saturday, Easter egg hunt on the beach ("flags-style") for the big kids on patrol and the End of Season Lifesaver Party on the Sunday night as a thank you to all active lifesavers. It was a costume party, with the theme "by day I am a lifesaver but by night I am a ...?" (no red and yellow patrol uniforms allowed). In

attendance were the Village People, a cave-man, a blue man, some fairy-tale characters, an ice hockey player, the blues brothers, a very convincing Doogs impersonator, a scuba diver, Hannah Montana and a pumpkin! All of these characters ate tacos, enchiladas (which were amazing- thanks Kirsty) and ice-cream sundaes and participated in party games normally reserved for Nippers including balloon tunnel-ball!

Highlights of the 2009/2010 Patrol season:

- A visit from action-man Andy in the LSV helicopter for "training" which turned a dreary March patrol into the patrol everyone wished they were at!
- Mr Norton (a teacher from Kew High School) being rescued by Jake and Doogs after his second-hand IRB "popped" on its first voyage.
- Chels and Jaz happily obliging to take photos of some good looking Swedish tourists, who described the March Cape water as "varm" despite the fact that they were the sole beach goers that afternoon!
- Blitzing our first patrol inspection and gaining the maximum bonus points available as a result of having 3 patrol captains plus the chief instructor, junior club captain and club captain on patrol! (Talk about an over-qualified patrol!).
- Chelsea's face when she thought there was a 3rd surprise patrol inspection late in the season but it turned out it was only Russ Stewart, District Officer, wearing a white t-shirt, coming to drop off some paperwork!
- The amazing range of costumes on display the End of Season Lifesaver Party!

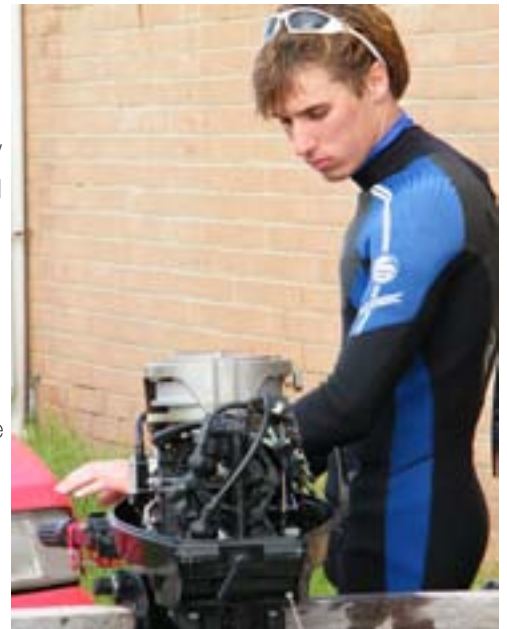
